UPDATE from your Covid Safety Team—we all long to be in the sanctuary for worship together. We offered in-person worship with only a few participants, until the # of cases in our county rose and schools went to full distance learning. Even though we did not have a large turn out for in-person worship, we will offer that again when the # of cases is lower.

- Please continue to open and read your weekly newsletter so that you are aware of when we make the shift to in-person worship again. You will still need to reserve a spot during the week to attend on Sundays because seating is limited [held in the Gathering Space/Narthex area where the airflow is better than the Sanctuary].
- We continue to work on a solution for worship in the Sanctuary. We've had several HVAC companies in to help us assess the air-flow deficiencies in the Sanctuary. We continue to work with COVID-19 and church guidelines as well as our insurance company's expectations.
- We will need more volunteers than we've traditionally had for worship services when we are able to be back in the Sanctuary [because of sanitation needs and physical distancing], so please help us prepare by emailing or calling the church office to let us know you'd be willing to be added to the list for worship assistance [usher, sanitize, help with contact tracing, etc]. We are assembling that list now, so we can be ready when we are able to shift back to worship in-person.

P: Go in peace. Christ is with us!. C: Thanks be to God!


The Ringing in of Christmas Joy to the World


