Synod-wide Worship Joins 140 Congregations Together this Weekend



Rev. Kelly Chatman, who serves as an advisor to our Bishop will be preaching. Pastor Chatman served as Senior Pastor at Church of the Redeemer in North Minneapolis until his recent retirement. He is the Director of Redeemer Center for Life.

Pastor Chatman challenges us to think about being Prophets in today's world and what that might mean for the church. Reminding us that prophets are those who tell the world that "God has not forgotten". Often, when we think of prophets, we think only of doom and gloom. But, the Biblical prophets, who spoke words of warning, were also the loudest voices of hope in their days.

The Scripture passages for this weekend challenge us to reposition ourselves as forgiven children of God who have a mission in this world. In Romans, chapter 7, St. Paul states a conundrum we are all too familiar with, when he writes: *"I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate."*

It is like the old cartoon that pictures a husband and wife waiting to cross the road, and just to the right of them, there is a street sign which reads: "Absolutely no machete juggling" and the caption is the husband saying: *"Suddenly, I have this urge to juggle machetes".*

We can always count on Paul to be brutally honest about the way we live. So, what then, do we say about this? We say: "Lord, help! Set us free from ourselves."

Paul has experienced another truth of our human existence: that God, in His abundant grace **has** set us free.

By God's grace, we are given the freedom to try again, so to speak. To learn and grow.

Set us free from ourselves."

As we celebrate our freedoms this 4th of July weekend, we should be reminded that with freedom come responsibilities. It is true for us as citizens of the United States, and it is true for us as citizens of God's beautiful family.

Part of our responsibility as Christians is to bring the light of love and justice into this world. We are free from the worry of our sinfulness [doing that which we know isn't right, as Paul describes] but our freedom is not just FROM, it is FOR something as well.

One way to bring this scripture passage into today's world is to ask yourself: What is it that Christ has set me free to *do*? What responsibilities am I being called to take on, in light of the freedom I have in Christ?

Our Prayer of the Day for this Sunday may help us begin to answer those questions:

You are great, O God, and greatly to be praised. You have made us for yourself, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you. Grant that we may believe in you, call upon you, know you, and serve you, through your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Amen.

• Plan to enter the Drive-In Worship via Fremont Ave/Cty. Rd. 4 and exit from the East [Fellowship Hall] side of the building.

- The service will be short, and the building and restrooms will not be available, so please make your "pit stop" prior to worship
- We love you and want to see you, but please, if you have any COVID-19 symptoms (cough, fever, shortness of breath, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, loss of taste or smell, diarrhea, etc.) worship online via our Facebook Page: <u>St. John Facebook Page</u>
- Sound will be completely controllable by you! via your FM radio in your vehicle.
- It is going to be so wonderful to see everyone ... and so tempting to get out of our cars to say "hi", but we Lutherans know how to avoid temptation, so we will stay in our vehicles.
- We will celebrate Holy Communion in our vehicles. [It is a *safe* bet that Luther never could have imagined it, even though he was a forward-thinking guy!]

Meeting called to order by President Shane Steinbrecher at 6:02 pm. Devotions and Prayer: Dawn Bourdeaux Motion by Jo and 2nd by Dawn to accept Agenda. Motion approved.

General Reports:

Pastor Report for May Council Meeting

Wednesday night worship. We normally would have ceased these worship services at this time and attendance has been dropping off a little for Wednesday night worship. Maybe do Bible study by zoom on Wednesday nights instead of the services? That way there will be more interaction. Advice: give the Bible study a try and see how much involvement we get in the summer.

Many churches are not planning to hold in-person worship services until the fall. That may change, of course. Suggestion: Maybe put a timeline out like the Governor did for the state. Or follow what the CDC says. For example: 50 people this is what should happen or 100 people this is what should happen.

Our insurance company has a check-list of what we need in place before we can open the church. Recommend supplying masks

Looking forward to once we do get back to in-person worship. When pastor has been talking with members, some have said they will continue to worship from home until a vaccine is available.

Looking forward to once we do get back to in-person worship together

Pastor will get some quotes on equipment that will make it easier for us to continue video services on line, Facebook and YouTube. We will have an electronic vote when that information is available. Will use the discretionary money.

Lizzie will start back in the office soon, other office staff will likely wait a bit longer.

Communion was brought up, maybe doing once a month, but no decision was made.

Pastor and Shane will put together a thank you to Kris for all the work he has done in getting services online.

Exterminators have been treating the church for the mouse infestation and Pastor has been talking to Wanda Thorson and Pat Kluge about the room with all the nativity items, which is a lot of fabric. They plan on going thru and putting all things that mice like in plastic totes. Right now they are planning to do this themselves but if they need help they will ask. Will be asking in the newsletter for plastic totes that people might have extra in their homes for donation to the church.

OPERATIONS

Team Charters: Continue to work on them.

Fence Request: A request to place a fence at the house property at no cost to the church. Renters will install and remove when they leave. Chris made a motion to approve and Carolyn 2nd the motion. Motion approved

FINANCE

Treasure Report. Tracking overall offering trending pretty favorably, we are lagging behind prior years. Expense side we are tracking close to budget. Year to date essentially breaking even on budget.

PPP \$37,400 arrived April 28th. This is tentatively a loan, but if all parameters are met maybe a forgivable loan. We are maintaining a strong balance sheet at this time mostly due to the PPP.

Cash flow is running at bit of deficit, which is expected given our current situation. Will go over in more depth when we meet in July at retreat.

ELCA has a formula to use for attendance with online viewing and when our numbers are plugged in to this formula, we are excited about the #'s of people who are finding their way to St. John worship online.
