






5 Steps to Building a Strong Foundation in Faith



FINANCIAL REVIEW

Congregational giving continues to be strong in 2020, but currently experiencing some shortfalls

- Thank you for all your generosity and continued support of St. John Lutheran Church
- Overview of total offerings of all funds received compared to plan (based on pledges):
 - o Offerings through March were slightly ahead of plan and April YTD near break-even
 - May through July results account for the current shortfall
 - Year-to-date (through July) approximately 12% or \$(14,000) below plan
 - Note, compared to last year's figures, YTD results down about \$(19,400)

Church expenses are under planned budget

Overall expenses incurred continue to be managed within planned budgeted figures

Overall results reflect a current operating deficit

- Through July, net results report deficit of \$(17,200), which is \$(13,300) below plan
- As reflected above, this deficit is largely due to offerings tracking behind plan the past three months

Payroll Protection Program ("PPP") to provide financial flexibility to SJLC

- As highlighted in the June 28th newsletter, this federal government program provided a form of relief to certain organizations, such as not-for-profit organizations (including churches)
 - o Provides federally guaranteed loans to cover payroll and other operating expenses
 - Council approved loan application and SJLC received a PPP loan of \$37,400
 - o Loan becomes eligible to be forgiven if certain parameters are met:
 - 1) staffing levels maintained and 2) funds used for 'eligible' expenses (e.g. payroll, utilities and mortgage interest) within prescribed time frame
- PPP Flexibility Act subsequently modified original parameters provided within CARES Act
 - Qualified expense threshold decreased from 75% to 60%
 - Covered period extended from eight weeks to 24 weeks (ends December 31st)
- SJLC is tracking favorably
 - Approximately 80% of overall expenses should be classified as qualified expenditures in the eight weeks following receipt of PPP funds. As such, currently within the revised parameters
 - Anticipated 100% forgiveness of loan
 - Council and finance committee to continue tracking and monitoring
- Funds strengthened overall balance sheet position





There are many people who help during worship. Color this picture of all the people who help during worship!





The lector reads from the Bible.












