TIKKUN OLAM

Tikkun Olam is committed this year as in years past to repairing the world. Our projects and funds promote Jewish values and social justice, locally, nationally and internationally.

ONGOING PROJECTS INCLUDE:

Providing meals to Operation Hope, twice per month

Ongoing commitment to the Connecticut Food Drive, Operation Hope Food Pantry, Nourish Bridgeport and Binky Patrol

Food drives in the fall (Operation Isaiah during the High Holiday season) and in the Spring (during the Passover Holiday)

Support of Shut in Jewish Elderly through Doriot

The November Annual Coat Drive

Collection of School supplies for adult learners through the Mercy Learning Center and the Bridgeport Public Library

Support to Camp Ramah, The Fresh Air Fund, and Bridgeport's Neighborhood Studios

Responding to National and international Disasters: These donations are usually made through Jewish Federations or Jewish Organizations with expertise in the response to such diasters.

The Tzedakah Charity of the Month. This project is usually integrated into the Bar/Bat Mitzvah Class Tzedakah Educational module and Contest. Tikkun Olam sponsors this project along with the Hebrew School for all Bar and Bat Mitzvah Candidates.

PROJECTS SPECIFIC TO 2022-2023

Afghan Refugee Resettlement Assistance: working with the Fairfield County IRRC, spearheaded by local area synagogues and First Church Congregational, Fairfield. One family has been resettled, awaiting a second anticipated to arrive in October.

Supporting already established Family Circles that have been set up to help individual Afghan families that are settling in our region

Assisting Displaced Ukrainians who have been forced to flee their homes in Ukraine due to the ongoing war in their country

Supporting The More Perfect Union: The Jewish Partnership for Democracy: This non-partisan plan mobilizes the Jewish Community to help secure Democracy by assisting free, safe and fair elections.
