CAT-4 Multi-Year Trend Report, Spring 2019

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INTRODUCTION AND EXPLANATION OF TERMINOLOGY

The data presented in this document represents a compilation of Canadian Achievement Test (CAT-4) results for Sudbury Christian Academy (SCA) from the past six academic calendar years. This year (spring 2019) was the second consecutive year when all grade levels from K-8 were tested. Prior to 2015, only grades 3 through 6 were tested. As such, data for some grades and cohorts of students do not exist for previous years.

Four sets of 6-year comparative data are presented for each class: a) a table which represents the composition of the class; b) the percentage of students at **Stanine 4** and above; c) the **mean national percentile rank** for the class; and the **mean grade equivalent** for the class.





Figure 1: Percentage of Students at Stanine 4 and Above (Grades 3-8)





Figure 4: Percentage of SK Students at Stanine 4 and Above






Figure 6: Mean Grade Equivalent (SK)







Figure 7: Percentage of Grade 1 Students at Stanine 4 and Above






Figure 10: Percentage of Grade 2 Students at Stanine 4 and Above






Figure 13: Percentage of Grade 3 Students at Stanine 4 and Above








Figure 15: Mean Grade Equivalent (Grade 3)





Figure 16: Percentage of Grade 4 Students at Stanine 4 and Above






Figure 18: Mean Grade Equivalent (Grade 4)





Figure 19: Percentage of Grade 5 Students at Stanine 4 and Above








Figure 21: Mean Grade Equivalent (Grade 5)





Figure 22: Percentage of Grade 6 Students at Stanine 4 and Above






Figure 24: Mean Grade Equivalent (Grade 6)





Figure 25: Percentage of Grade 7 Students at Stanine 4 and Above






Figure 27: Mean Grade Equivalent (Grade 7)





Figure 28: Percentage of Grade 8 Students at Stanine 4 and Above






Figure 30: Mean Grade Equivalent (Grade 8)







Figure 31: Percentage of Students at Stanine 4 and Above (Class of 2019)






Figure 34: Percentage of Students at Stanine 4 and Above (Class of 2020)






Figure 37: Percentage of Students at Stanine 4 and Above (Class of 2021)






Figure 40: Percentage of Students at Stanine 4 and Above (Class of 2022)






Figure 43: Percentage of Students at Stanine 4 and Above (Class of 2023)




Figure 46: Percentage of Students at Stanine 4 and Above (Class of 2024)
