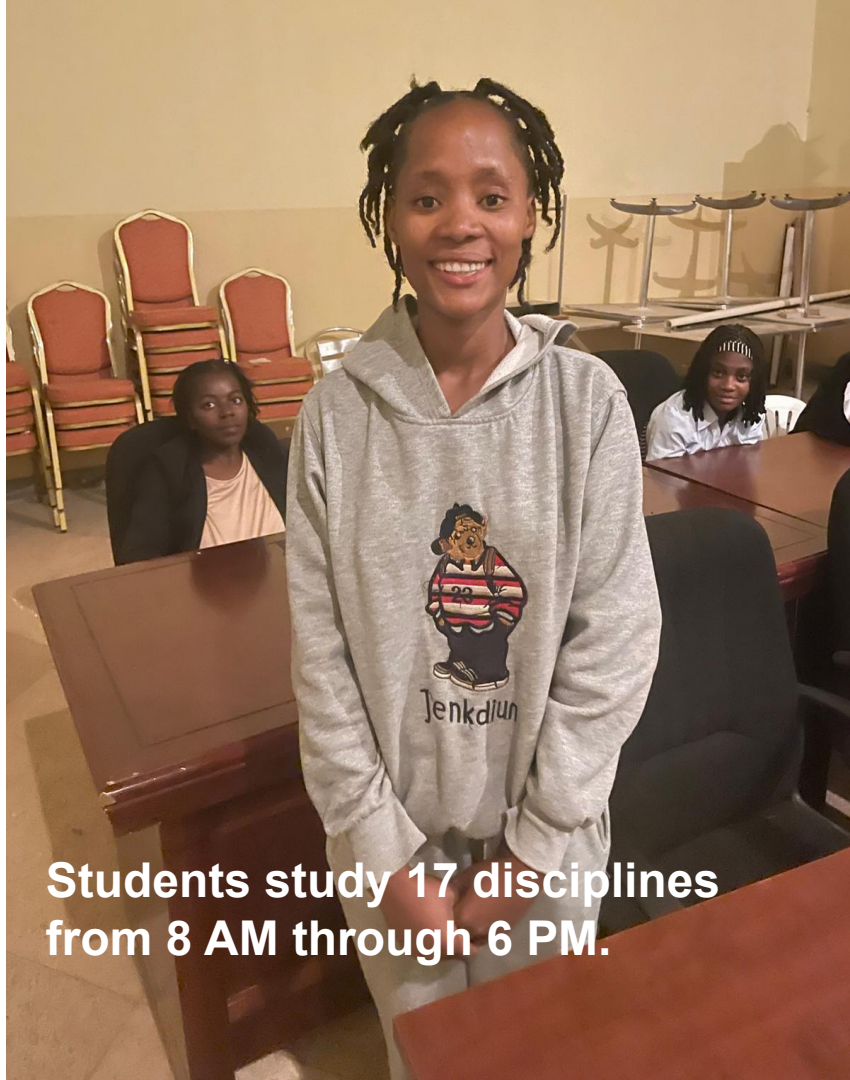

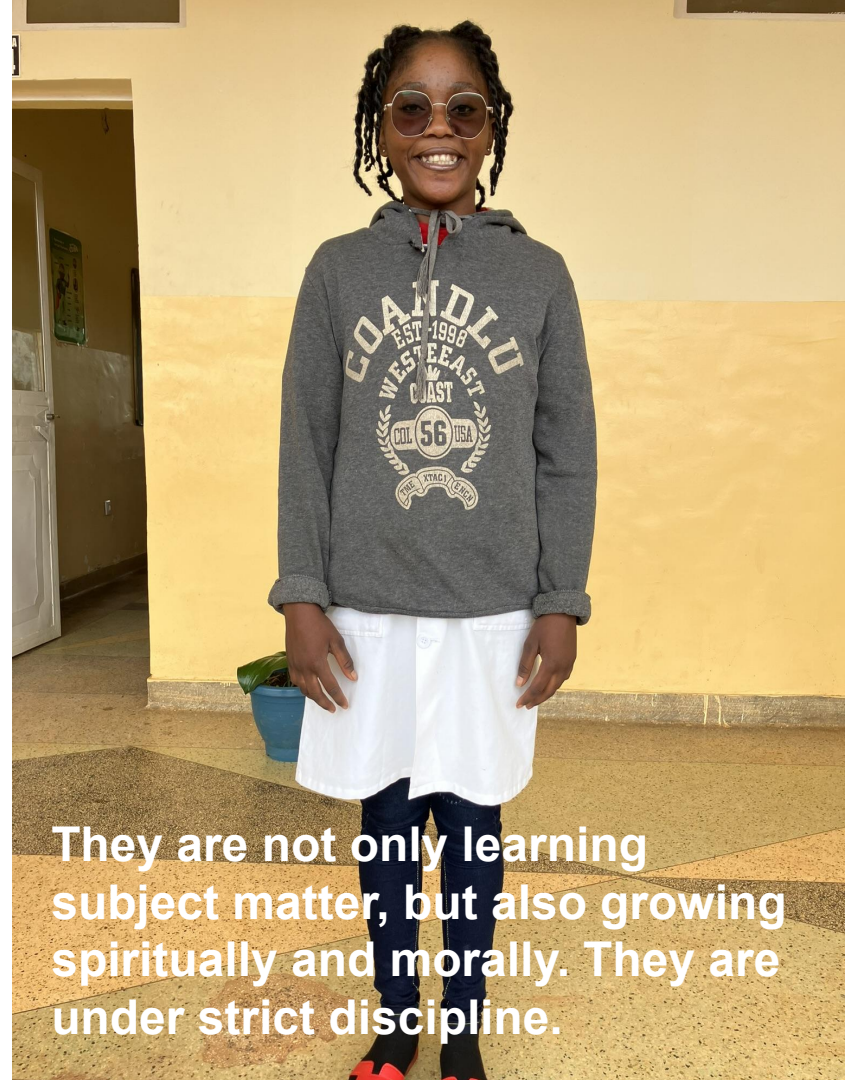


AWEF students at Vavayela

They are not only learning subject matter, but also growing spiritually and morally. They are under strict discipline.

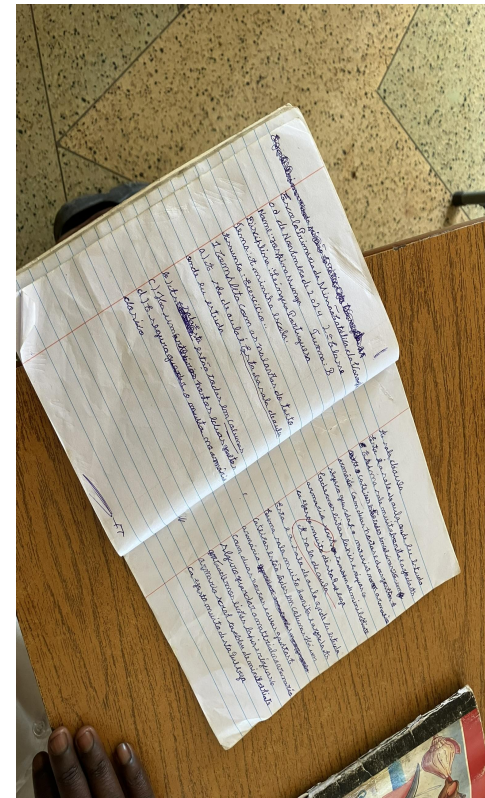
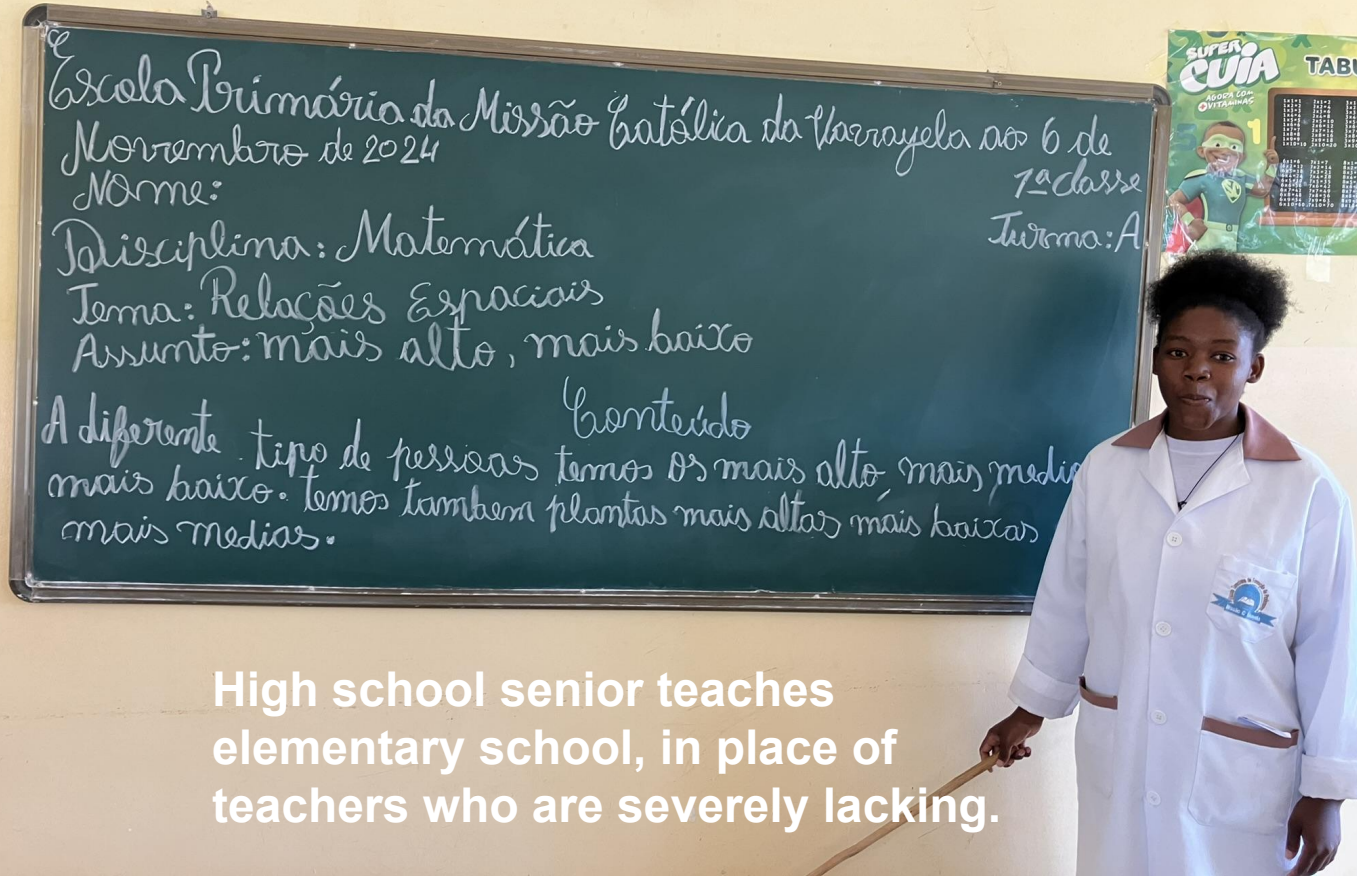
