There's a boldness in our prayers and a unity in our purpose. The future isn't just bright, it's Spirit-led. And I believe the best is truly yet to come.

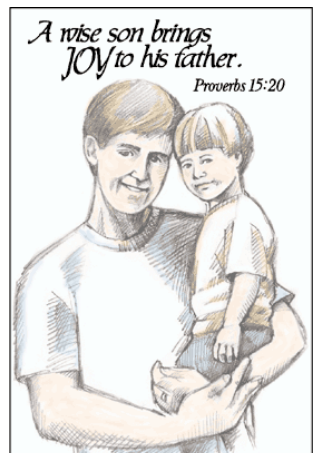
I would like to share a quote from a sign that was up at our 10-year anniversary celebration on March 28, 1992...

The word of God says in II Corinthians 9:6-8
