WORDS FROM WANG – "Sometimes We Go Flat: a Musical Analogy for Sin"

Recently, Judy and I had the good fortune to observe a choral festival for children's choirs sponsored by an organization within the Roman Catholic Church. The festival took place at Holy Name Cathedral; one of the prominent churches owned and operated by the Chicago Diocese. Our son Josh, who works as music director for Good Shepherd Catholic Church in Golden Valley, Minnesota, was in attendance with one of the children's choirs from his parish that he leads. The two-day festival culminated with all the choirs joining together in a Saturday evening mass; and being that we only live an hour from Chicago it was convenient for us to attend as spectators.

The Most Reverend Mark Bartosic (a bishop with the Chicago Archdiocese) offered the evening homily which was themed for the season of Lent. At one point, addressing the children in the choirs, the bishop recalled his younger years when he sang with his school choir and how his favorite choir director would sometimes walk over to the piano and play a chord right after the choir had finished rehearsing an a capella piece (without the aid of accompaniment) and thus quickly pointing out that "they had gone flat."

Eventually, the Bishop tied in the idea of our ability to go flat musically with our human tendency to slip into sin; or the human inclination toward sin and evil. Then he used a word that was possibly foreign to some of the kids and the word was *concupiscence*. To Catholics, "concupiscence" is actually this inclination toward sin and evil. That while it is highly likely to cause sin, concupiscence is not sin itself. Baptism represents that point in our lives when our slates are considered wiped clean and the human faith journey begins with all its twists, turns, temptations, and transformations. But our leaning toward sin and evil persists, however, and we must resist the "inclination" to sin by avoiding taking that first step in the wrong direction; in essence to stop ourselves before we go too far.

Though the different sects of Christianity vary slightly on the theology of sin and evil, most agree that words like contrition, remorse, regret, or penitence are used in worship to provide all we sinners with the opportunity to regain our footing with God, so to speak, and thus receive the gift of God's grace, forgiveness, and redemption. And not just in Lent, but 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and 52 weeks a year.

As any musician knows, a lot of discipline and practice goes into preparing a piece; to make it "performance ready." And nobody likes to be told "you were flat" at any point in the process, especially when we "go public." And even the most seasoned musicians agree that once we stop utilizing the tools that we have received in our musical training, we will surely go flat. The same is true in our faith experiences and our inclination to slide into sin. For even the most mature Christian will tell you that the instruction we receive is crucial to our maintaining a right relationship with God and the world around us and will help us to avoid the tendency to stray. But when we do go flat, we always have the option of getting back on pitch. With God's help.

Note: spell check reminds us that when we drop the "G" from the word "SING," it becomes SIN. And let the people LOL. Here's wishing you a blessed Lenten journey.


