I'm tired of the mud-slinging. How 'bout you?

I'm tired of the name-calling. How 'bout you?

I'm tired of certain so-called Christians condemning others to Hades because of their different beliefs or interpretations. How 'bout you?

I'm tired of campaign ads that do everything in their powers to make the opposition look incompetent and corrupt; or blaming those holding current positions for all the things wrong with our state or nation. How 'bout you?

I'm tired of people using the name of Jesus Christ to push their own agendas even when there is nothing in the bible to warrant such assertions. How 'bout you?

I'm tired of all that divides us as a nation, as states, communities, and even as churches. How 'bout you?

All of the mud-slinging is not helping the current climate for small local churches and many of us fear for our future as an institution. That is a legitimate concern. In the end, however, I hope you will remember that we still possess a genuine trust in the God who has inspired churches throughout the ages. As one of our denominational leaders puts it, "we are not mere survivors in an uncertain chapter of Church. We are resilient explorers, nimble navigators, courageous apostles of the living Christ, assigned to a daunting task we didn't ask for: partnering with the Holy Spirit to discern the future of the church and co-creating our way there."

One of the underlying strengths of the wider United Church of Christ is what he calls "spiritual solidarity," a value traceable to the denomination's motto: "That they may all be one." "We belong to each other and we continually seek to widen our circle of inclusion," he said, "so much so that we proclaim, 'No matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here."

And the ever-widening circle extends to those different from ourselves (or those who differ). "If we are to fully practice the extravagant hospitality of Jesus, it needs to extend back to those who aren't quite as progressive as we might like, but at the same time, forward to those who share deep experiences of the sacred beyond the walls of the institutional church," he concluded.

These are useful words as we (Old Stone Church and 1st Cong. Pec) explore new ways to be the church. I will never get tired of saying that the key to being viable is "commitment and innovation."

According to my calendar, I've been with the Old Stone Church 18 months now; my original contract being 36 months (with the option of extending). I believe we're on the right track and with our "stronger together" motto in our shared ministry, I am confident that God is doing a new thing and it's all good! I'm not tired of trying new things. How 'bout you?




Flames of the Spirit: "Hearts on Fire"




December 10 - Chicago Day


Sunday School Starting 9/18!
