#### **WORDS FROM WANG** – "Are You Ready for an Advent-ure?"

The word *advent* comes from the Latin term, *adventus* meaning "arrival" or "coming," particularly the coming of something having great importance. Advent as a season is both a time of joy-filled, <u>anticipatory</u> celebration of the arrival of Jesus Christ and includes the practices of repentance, meditation, and penance. Some call it a "mini Lent," but without the fasting. Quite the opposite, as families and friends gather for feasts and merriment in what many have dubbed "the most wonderful time of the year."

But wait...there's more. The key word hear being "wait." By now you know I have a bit of a pet peeve when it comes to beginning the celebrations. Namely, prematurely putting up the decorations and playing/singing Christmas songs, or going around saying "Merry Christmas." Merriam-Webster defines the word wait as: to stay in place in expectation of; to delay serving, as in a meal. It also means to remain stationary in readiness or expectation; to look forward to and hold back expectantly. All of this is saying that celebrating the birth of Christ is not something intended to happen once the Halloween decorations are put away. Nor is it designed to be an extension of the Thanksgiving holiday (no thanks to the retail world's invention of Black Friday).

In short, it took hundreds of years for the long-awaited Messiah to appear to those who longed for the event to occur. In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David; and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. (Jeremiah 33:14-15)

And waiting can truly enhance our understanding of God's will for us - and should therefore be reflected in the ways that we prepare. So, do yourselves a favor. Don't rush Christmas.
