WORDS FROM WANG – Patience Truly is A Virtue

By now, many of you are aware of at least one or two of my personal pet peeves. And one of the biggest peeves is fast-forwarding from Halloween to Christmas without as much as a thought or glimpse of the season of preparation; the "come thou long expected Jesus" period of watching and waiting. Advent.

As a person called by God to uphold some of the long-standing traditions of our faith, it is my job to remind you of the practice (even discipline) of *living in the waiting* as Christians have done for centuries. It's called the season of Advent for a reason. So, as hard as it is to WAIT, there is a good liturgical reason to hold off singing the beloved Christmas carols until the appropriate time; specifically at the start of the Christmas season,

The word "advent" derives from the Latin "adventus", meaning "coming." During its earliest observances, Advent (not unlike Lent) was 40 days of repentance, fasting and prayer as new believers prepared for their baptisms. Later Christians began tying Advent not just to Christ's incarnation, but to an anticipated second coming of Christ. Advent became a period for renewing the anticipation and longing for Jesus' return.

Today, Advent is a period of preparation for both "advents" or arrivals--of Jesus. Lester Ruth, a professor at Duke Divinity School and a historian of Christian worship, offered this distinction for Advent: "The simplest way I have to distinguish between Advent and Christmas is that advent uses the word "come" as a longing petition, expressed in anticipation. Whereas Christmas is a commemorative reflection on how the Lord "has come" in Christ's birth and thus the trigger for a new redemptive order has begun."

As cliché as it sounds, good things DO come to those who wait - patiently.

Paul in his letter to the Ephesians wrote. "*I, therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.*" Ephesians 4:1-3

Let us pray, "God of hope, I look to you with an open heart and yearning spirit. During this Advent season, I will keep alert and awake, listening for your word and keeping to your precepts. My hope is in you." Amen.

May this holiday season bring you a sense of peace as you enjoy the process and anticipate the outcome. See ya' in church.



<u>Celebrate Winter Solstice</u> – Tuesday, December 20th @ 6:00 p.m.

The term "solstice" comes from the Latin words *sol* (Sun) and *sistere* (to stand still) because, during the solstice, the angle between the Sun's rays and the plane of the Earth's equator appears to stand still. For a few days before and after the solstice, the Sun's path across the sky appears to freeze. This is all thanks to Earth's tilted axis, which makes it so that one half of Earth is pointed away from the Sun and the other half is pointed towards it at the time of the solstice. The winter solstice, marks what many cultures believe to be a "rebirth" of the Sun as the hours of daylight gradually increase.

Certain pagan festivals around the winter solstice originally included rituals like the burning of a yule log which, like many other seasonal rituals, was eventually tied to the Christmas holiday. Even the inclusion of evergreen boughs, wreathes, and trees have their roots in winter solstice festivals.

This year, the winter solstice will occur December 21, 2022, at 4:48 P.M. EST and marks the start of astronomical winter in the Northern Hemisphere. However, the OSC Green Team is planning a winter solstice observance event on the evening prior, Tuesday the 20th.

Green team members, Mari Weikel and Ken Thomson have offered to host our event at their home which sports an awesome outdoor fire-pit located on their "peninsula." The evening will consist of warm fellowship, story telling, poetry reading, singing, a campfire, and refreshments like hot cider, seasonal appetizers, and sweet treats. Participants are welcome to offer any of the above.

We do ask attendees consider bringing a seasonal appetizer or dessert to share (you can google suggestions for winter solstice observances. The internet offers much on the topic). If the weather is bearable we do plan on being outside for a portion of the evening so guests should come prepared for cold weather. However, their hearth and home will be open regardless.


