And every mile has been a marker for some event, worship service, committee meeting, fellowship opportunity, home visit, or a memorial service, a meal, a concert, a wedding, a coffee house, or simply time spent in the office.

We began this journey amid a global pandemic, and we were gathering to worship and perform ministry when many churches were still doing it remotely. And like many other communal entities, we responded the best we could to the many challenges associated with the major shift that our culture was, and still is, living through. But through it all we remained faithful to our calling. We had our losses, but thankfully we can also count the many victories celebrated enroute to the moment we find ourselves in today. We are the product of the new thing God has been doing and the road ahead is filled with nothing but opportunities.

It is with great joy and satisfaction that this epistle is being shared with a second congregation of hearty church folk as we recognize perhaps the most God-inspired accomplishment of my tenure; the formation of a shared ministry that will be forever known as Crooked River Ministries. But you can decrease the chances of that happening if you actually give it to them in the first place; and not just once, but twice, or even three or more times. Yes, we're human. BTW, wearing your name tag REALLY HELPS.

As I said in my resignation letter, it has been a privilege to work with so many wonderful people and I truly believe we have accomplished a great deal together. I can only hope that I have made a fraction of a difference in your lives as you have made in mine.




