Old Stone Church Presents: an "All Church Summer Vacation Retreat" July 22-24 (Thursday-Saturday) at Pilgrim Park Camp in Princeton, IL

Pastor Bob has been a long-time supporter of and participant in the many outdoor ministry opportunities availed us in our various church camp settings throughout the country. During college years, he even spent three summers working on the site staff with the Ohio Conference camps. The United Church of Christ camps have worked in covenant with the various conferences and associations and have historically been breeding grounds for those who are called to serve as local church pastors. Needless to say, the outdoor ministries of the UCC remain invaluable to the churches that have supported and directly benefited from involvement with the camps.

But, like so many institutions, our camps have taken a hit during Covid times and it's up to the local churches to help keep our camps open and functioning as a vital extension of our church's mission and purpose. This year, our two Illinois Conference camps (Tower Hill and Pilgrim Park) are not able to open again for their usual summer sponsored events which presents local churches with the unique (and rare) opportunity to actually use the camps for their own summer programming. Therefore, it is our prayer that the Old Stone Church can rally around this cause and this "once in a lifetime opportunity" to gather at camp to make some great memories, build our own community, and get closer to God in the process. A more detailed flier will be arriving at your homes via first class mail. Please help *Rekindle the Flame* and consider signing up to go to camp.

Participation: Any age singles, couples, families (any combination), grandparents/grandchildren, and/or guests of church members, etc.

Location: Pilgrim Park, our UCC camp located in Princeton, IL (approx. 100 miles from Rockton) **Lodging:** Pilgrim Park Conference Center (hotel-style rooms with private baths) **Meals:** Buffet style in the attached camp dining room.

Cost: \$200 for individuals or first member of your family and \$100 for each additional family member. (cost includes 2 nights lodging, and five meals beginning with breakfast on Friday and ending with lunch on Saturday.

Activities: Ample time for community building, campfires, vespers, late night chats, movies, group singing, group games, crafts, archery (staff supervised), paddle boats, swimming (guarded camp pool), hiking, creek walks (staff led), bible study, discussion groups, nature studies (camp naturalist), more community building, activities for kids, scheduled free time, and optional off-site trips into Princeton.
