Words From Wang – June is Busting Out All Over

The Search Process

In April we celebrated the ratification of the shared ministry covenant allowing us to move forward with a joint search for a settled pastor to serve the Crooked River Ministries. We are happy to report that a search committee has been named with representation from both churches.

The committee is planning its first meeting for early in June. Many meetings will take place via zoom which is standard for most search committees with in-person meetings being reserved for follow up interviews with candidates later in the process. The first steps are to establish roles, discuss goals and objectives, and revising and/or developing church profiles for each church.

Very soon, we hope to have the new Associate Conference Minister for Pastoral Transitions available to provide guidance and denominational direction to the process. Her name is Rev. Shernell Edney Stilley and she will be joining the Illinois Conference staff some time this spring or early summer.

At any point during the process we will welcome any questions or suggestions. Once a chair person and corresponding secretary are named to our committee we will provide their contact information. As we will throughout the whole process, we ask for continued prayers for the work of the committee that God will bless and inspire those who work on behalf of both churches.

We remain excited about the possibilities that exist as we explore and envision opportunities that our shared ministry provides. Please feel free to approach any members of the team with ideas or questions on our shared ministry.
