Or are they themselves hurting and in need of some support or a compassionate listening ear? There is so much of the individual person that is missing by remaining anonymous.

On the flip side, I'm happy to report, that over the years I have had some awe-inspiring conversations with people who have either written to me and signed their name, or who actually came forward with their concerns or questions. There's nothing better than a good heart to heart, face to face conversation between two of God's beloved. And the amazing thing about it, the outcome of the conversation always includes a plan for moving forward. But more importantly, the conversation included a mutual understanding between both parties because we were able to engage in kind and respectful dialogue where both sides were heard. Now in my humble opinion, that's amazing grace.



If you are planning on your children participating in Sunday School, please contact Lindsey in the church office, so we can be sure to get a good estimate of how many kids we can expect to see week to week.


