'Impact' is an increasingly important factor in academic work and this applies to PhD research too – especially if you're funded. Even if your panel doesn't explicitly ask about impact, it's a good idea to mention what you hope the wider outcome of your project might be. If you are asked this question – and are prepared for it – this is a great chance to get a leg up on the competition. Impact essentially refers to the measurable effects of research outside academia. hikkaa jechoota afaan oromoo pdf It's a given that your PhD will have an effect on future work in your field. But universities are increasingly focussed on the benefits of their work beyond the 'ivory tower' of higher education and

research. This is particularly important if your project is funded.

The money supporting your studies will probably have come from public revenues (via a Research Council studentship) or from a large charity or trust. Those organisations will want to make sure their investment is worthwhile. Examples of impact differ a bit between fields. If you're in the Social Sciences you may already have some idea of the 'outputs' from your project.
