



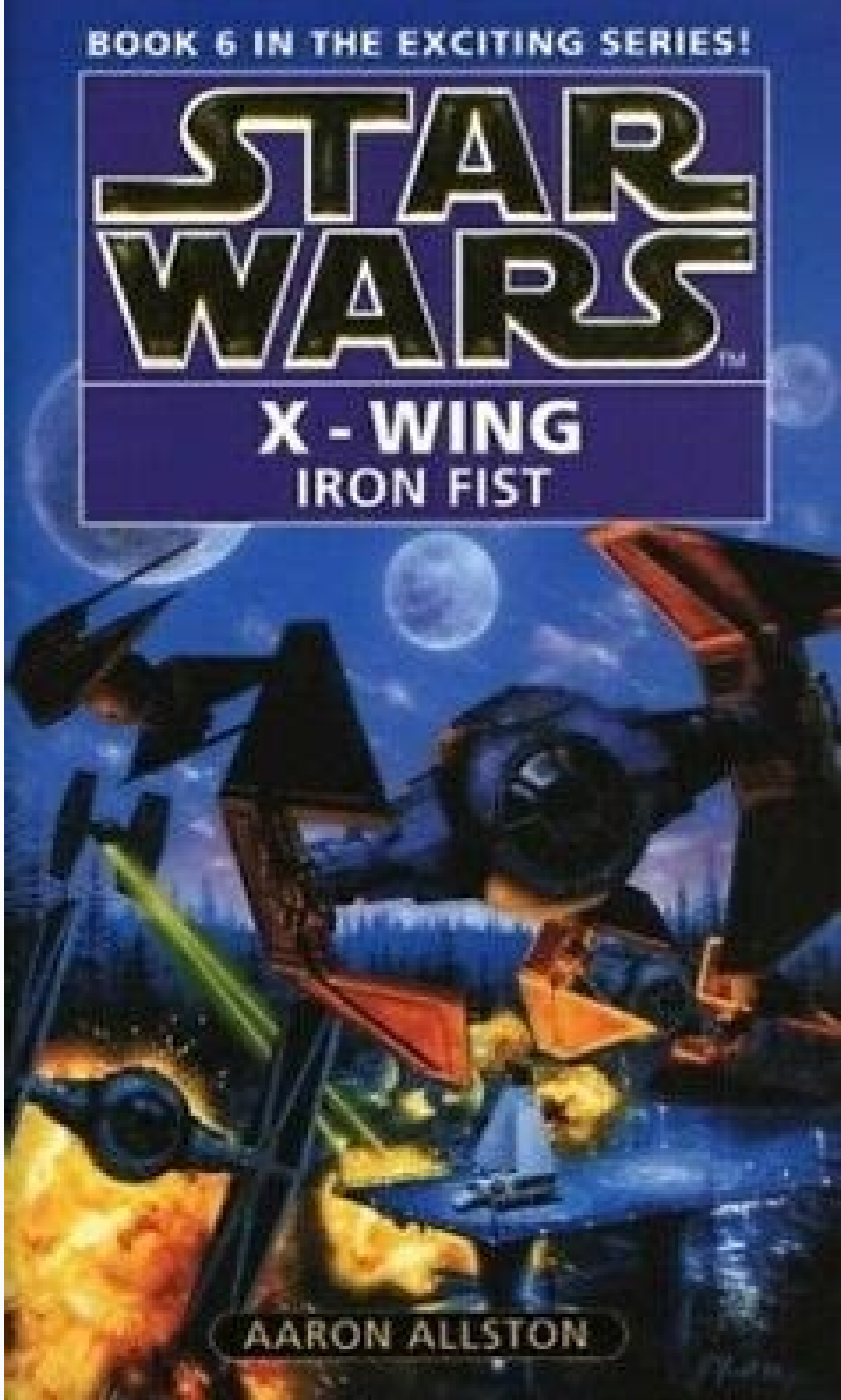

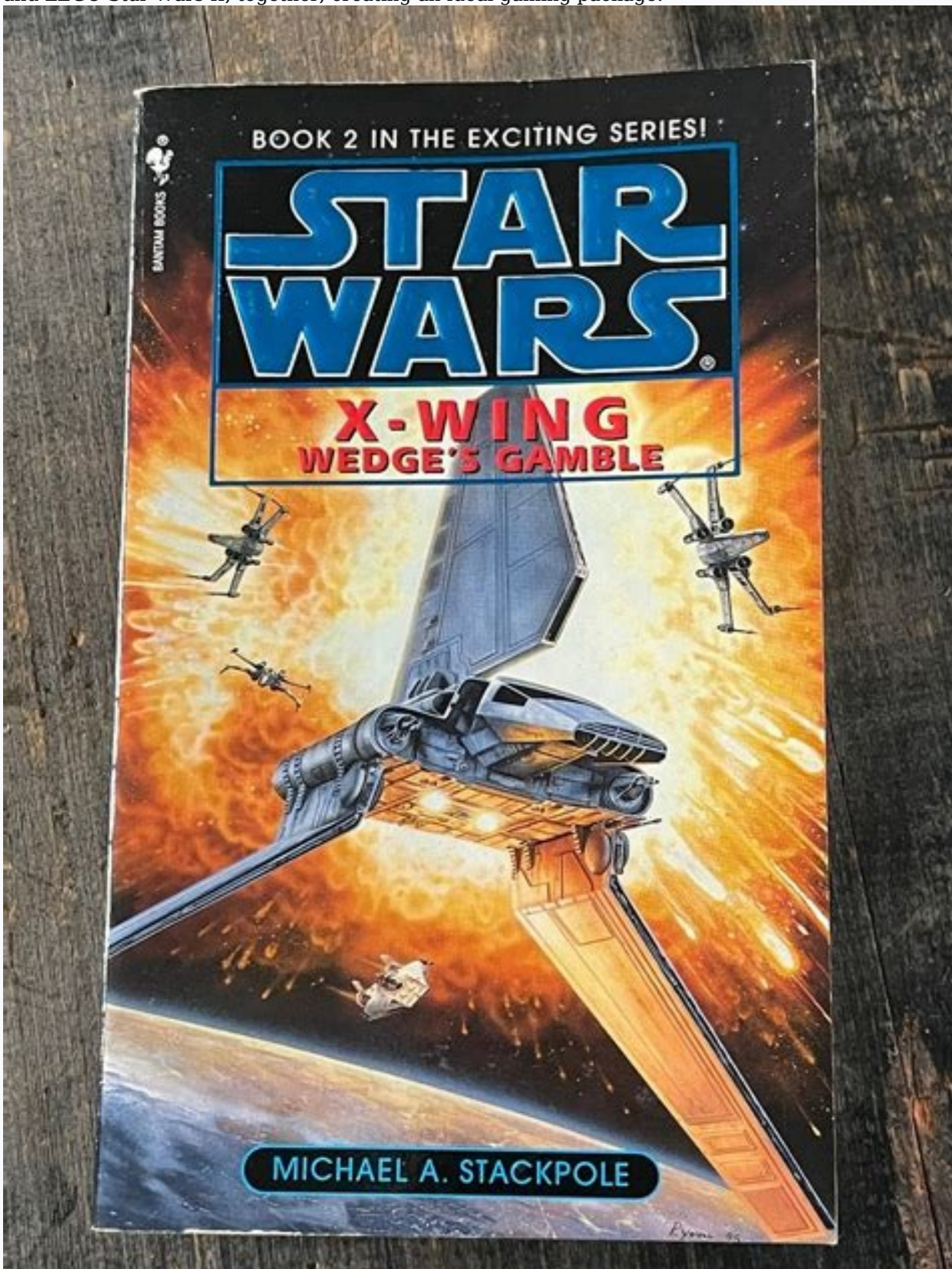

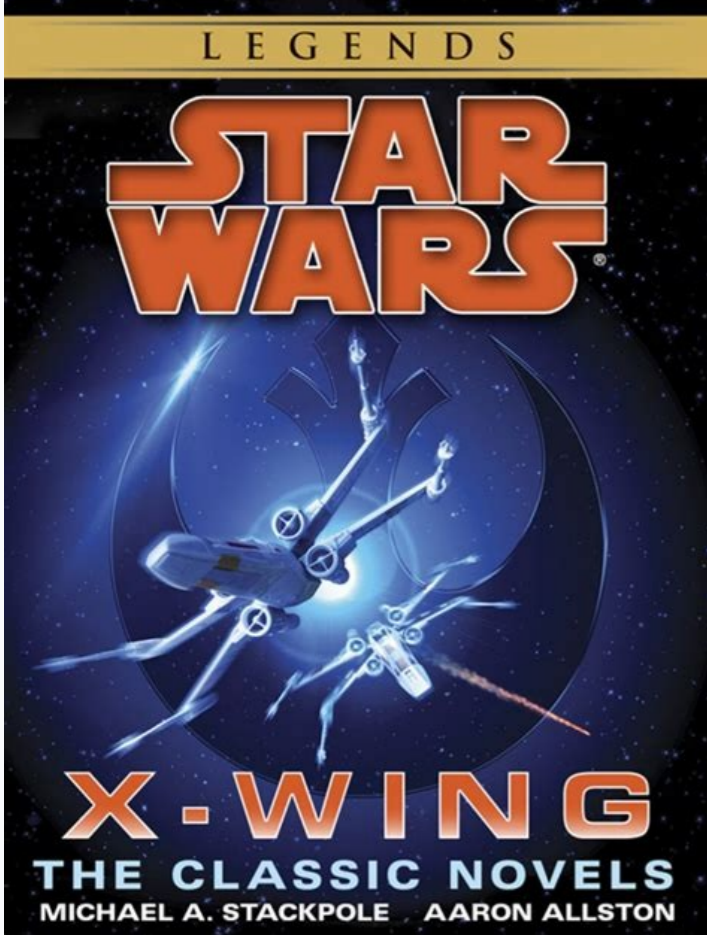

The game introduced Kyle Katarn, the protagonist and a bounty hunter who works for the Rebel Alliance. During a mission, Kyle learns about Dark Troopers, a deadly secret of stormtrooper under development in a secret Imperial facility. Your job is to destroy the entire operation. To do that, you have to face stormtroopers and other characters from the Star Wars universe in different stages of the game. It also includes fun environmental puzzles along with mission briefings and excellent cut-scenes. Your character, Iden Versio is the leader of a specially trained group of Imperial Forces known as Inferno Squad, who are responsible for sabotaging rebel bases and suppressing any anti-Imperial activities in the Galaxy. Sure playing as a protagonist may be weird at first, but you will feel good about how things turn out later. The campaign mode also allows players to control other famous characters in the Star Wars universe, such as Luke Skywalker and Kylo Ren. Despite being a versatile and a pretty decent game, Battlefront II faced the wrath of dedicated gamers community almost instantly after its release due to almost inescapable in-game "micro-transactions" implemented by its publisher electronic arts. 7. Star Wars Episode I: Racer Platform: Windows, Game Boy Color, Mac OS, Nintendo 64 LucasArt's Episode 1: Racer is a thrilling racing video game that focuses on the podracing events of Star Wars: Episode I - The Phantom Menace. Released in 1999, the Racer became the first-over racing game in the Star Wars franchise, and it remains ever so relevant. X-Wing Platform: Windows, Linux, DOS The Star Wars X-Wing is the first game in the X-Wing combat flight simulator series, in which player pilots the iconic X-wing plane from the Star Wars universe. The game begins inside a Mon Calamari Star Cruiser, where you will be greeted with a gateway, from where you can choose missions.



Initially, the game only offered A-wing, X-wing, and Y-wing crafts, the B-Wing was added after an expansion. There are three sets of missions that you need to complete, with each having a maximum of 14 operations. Although you can randomly choose between missions-sets, operations can only be played in linear order.



While Star Wars: X-Wing is not exactly a carbon copy of the movies, it does feature familiar sound effects, yelling, and other small details that make this game special. 5. Jedi Knight II: Jedi Outcast Platform: Windows, OSX, Xbox Have you ever fancied living a Jedi life? Yes, then this could be the perfect game for you. Just like the two previous installments in the series, Jedi Outcast put you in control of character Kyle Katarn, a pro-rebellion mercenary who devoted his entire life to fighting the dark side. As a force-sensitive individual, your character's job is to put an end to the advancements of the Imperial Stormtrooper, dark Jedi, and other enemies. You will do that over 24 levels around eight different planetary systems. But here is a twist, although Kyle is force sensitive, he doesn't start the game with any force powers, not even with a lightsaber. These powers can only be gained after completing specific missions. As the game goes on, your character will run into others, including Luke and his friend Lando Calrissian. You will also encounter many hostile characters. The plot moves forward with intriguing in-game cut-scenes that provide superior animation effects. 4. Rogue Squadron II: Rogue Leader Platform: Gamecube Rogue Leader is the second installment of fan-favorite series Star Wars Rogue Squadron co-developed by German game developer Factor 5 and LucasArts. Like its prequel, Rogue Leader revolves around the original trilogy, where the player controls characters of Luke Skywalker and Wedge Antilles, a rebel pilot. Your journey as a rebellion starts with an attack on the first Death Star. From there on, you will take on enemy forces in various missions across the galaxy. There are a total of ten principle missions with a few secret levels that you can enjoy.
