When you transfer the ownership of a vehicle in the State of New Jersey you have to fill all the required details including the Odometer Disclosure Statement on the reverse side of the vehicle's Certificate of Title.

Connecticut Odometer Disclosure Statement

Federal and State law requires that you state the mileage in connection with the transfer of ownership. Failure to complete or providing a false statement may result in fines and/or imprisonment.

Furthermore you may need to complete also the state-approved Odometer Disclosure Statement Form OS/SS-2 in certain cases. In the State of New Jersey the following vehicles are exempt from odometer disclosure requirements: all vehicles model year 2010 or older, all vehicles over 16,000 lbs., low-speed vehicles (LSV), non-motorized vehicles (trailer-type), and mopeds or scooters. In any case we recommend to complete also the odometer disclosure form found below in any type of transaction. Also the odometer disclosure statement Form OS/SS-2 is only a supplement to a fully assigned Certificate of Title. See more details below. You also need to be careful and not to make any mistakes when you write on the back of the vehicle's title certificate. Please read first all the details before you start to write on the title! Any erasure, cross-out or alteration will void the title and in this case you need a duplicate title before you can transfer the ownership. It is important to mention as well that an inaccurate statement, or failure to complete an odometer statement, may result in fines and/or imprisonment! Below you will find details about the state-approved fillable PDF Form OS/SS-2 for your use. In the State of New Jersey you may need to fill in the New Jersey Odometer Disclosure Statement Form - Form OS/SS-2 (R1/19). If you're not sure how to complete an odometer reading you can find details here: Reading the Odometer - How to read an Odometer. Tip: to complete the New Jersey Odometer Disclosure Statement Form on your device (computer / phone / tablet) open the PDF form in Adobe Acrobat Reader. You can complete this form by hand. However in this case don't forget to use a pen with black or blue ink and not a pencil! Below we have instructions to accurately fill out the odometer disclosure statement on the back of the New Jersey Certificate of Title. Please use a pen with black or blue ink and not a pencil!

If you visit a motor vehicle agency: You must provide proof that a correction is needed. There is no charge to correct a title if the error was clearly caused by the MVC. In all other cases, the title correction charge is \$60. The MVC accepts American Express® card, Visa® card, MasterCard®, Discover card®, checks, money orders and cash. If you submit a written request through the mail: Include the original document along with a letter stating what needs to be corrected and proof of the error. Include a check or money order for \$60 payable to the NJMVC (unless you can show the error was clearly caused by the MVC). The letter must include the make, year, and full Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) of the vehicle. Bring the letter and the title to a motor vehicle agency for correction. Title corrections - incomplete sale If the buyer decides not to purchase a vehicle after the seller already completed the information on the title, this means the title is "spoiled" and the seller will need to take corrective action. The current owner may visit a motor vehicle agency to request the correction and bring the original title. There is a \$60 fee. The MVC accepts American Express® card, Visa® card, MasterCard®, Discover card®, checks, money orders and cash. The current owner may also submit a request through the mail. This request must include: A letter containing the owner's name and the make, year and full Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) of the vehicle; as well as an explanation as to why the title is spoiled, e.g., why the sale did not go through. The original title and a check or money order for \$60 payable to the NJMVC. Send the package to: New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission Database Corrections Unit PO Box 141 225 East State Street Trenton, NJ 08666-0141 Title corrections - odometer replacements (mail only) In the case of an odometer replacement, the current owner must provide a signed statement from the mechanic who replaced the odometer. Any and all odometer discrepancies must be corrected before a sale can take place. If the replacement is a used odometer, the mileage must be reset. The previous and replacement odometer amounts are added together (last known mileage from the vehicle and mileage from the new odometer) and should be marked as "N/A" (not actual). In addition, the mechanic must affix a sticker on the driver-side door pillar indicating the following: The date of installation. The vehicle's last known mileage prior to the repair or replacement. The mileage added to the vehicle while the odometer was inoperable, if any. Note: All mileage is marked as "N/A" (not actual).
