UPDATES TO MEMBERSHIP STANDINGS ARE COMPLETED EVERY WEDNESDAY. CHECK DEPARTMENT WEBSITE (<u>WWW.DEPTNY.ORG</u>) to chart your unit/county/district's progress. The Department finished last year just 1300 short of our goal. Top Dog Mary (Pug) and the Vice Presidents (Golden Doodles) are counting on all of the Rottweilers (County), Labrador Retrievers (Unit), German Shepherds (Past Department Presidents) and Cocker Spaniels (all unit) members to help us reach our goal of 36,474.

There are many awards both Department and National that our membership teams are eligible to receive. The first deadline is October 15, 2021, for 100% membership for both Counties and Units. The next deadline is November 11, 2021, for 100% membership (both Department and National). So, get that membership in today! The dog days of summer are over, time to get to work for our Veterans and Families.

The Veterans Affairs and Rehabilitation Committee commonly referred to as VA&R is one of the most important committees. It is the reason the American Legion Auxiliary formed, and the reason we belong.

Our mission in promoting this committee is to enhance the lives of our active military, veterans, and their families. We can accomplish this mission and support rehabilitation of veterans through arts, crafts, and hobbies. This can occur on a small scale at your post, community center, senior housing, or Veterans Hospitals.

For those who have a VA Hospital in your community, contact them to see if you can volunteer. Maybe your unit can host a game night, like bingo, card games or other activities. Some hospitals are not allowing visitors in right now. You can inquire as to needed items such as blankets, robes or other personal items that can be dropped off at the hospital entrance.

Service to Veterans refers to those activities provided outside hospitals. You could mow your veteran neighbor's lawn, shop for groceries, or just visit with them.

Do not forget to recognize and support the Caregivers. You could offer to sit with the veteran so the caregiver can go get a cup of coffee, take a walk, or just take a break.

Whatever activities your unit or members provide make sure you report it. These hours and activities are then reported to congress, to show the need for benefits and programs for our veterans. When submitting the VA&R report, please write the names of volunteers' hours for each individual on the back of the form or add a second page if emailing. This will make it easier to keep accurate account of hours needed to award volunteer service bars and pins.

I just received a request from National VA&R Committee Chairman Lisa Williamson. She is asking units/members to send in pictures of VA&R activities. Reminder, please email original photos at the highest resolution and do not copy and paste photos.

The Children and Youth program emphasizes protecting, caring for, and supporting children and youth, particularly those of veterans' and military families. Please see the 2021-2022 Department of NY Plan of Action Supplement for all awards under this committee.

Star Spangled Kids has been moved to the Americanism committee by national two years ago, so please report it under Americanism.

The ALA Halloween coloring book is available on the national website <u>www.alaforveterans.org</u> for downloading or purchasing.

Good Deed and Youth Hero awards. These are national awards and require our Department Secretary Barbara Corker's signature for certification by Department to be considered. When emailing to Barbara at <u>nyalasecretary@gmail.com</u>, please copy me at <u>nyalachildrenandyouth@gmail.com</u> or you can still send them in the mail directly to the Department office.

The Child Welfare Foundation has awards in the Plan of Action that are given by The American Legion. Do you have the CWF piggy banks? Do you collect spare change at your meetings? Do you make regular donations?

At the risk of sounding like a broken record, as we start our new Auxiliary year, it is time to review our governing documents. Some of our units and counties have not updated our Constitution and Bylaws for over twenty years. Certainly, at least our eligibility, meeting days and times, and dues have changed in that long. You need to find those forms and refresh them. To do this, simply go to the Department website and download the simple form that applies to you. Then fill in the blanks. You don't need to rewrite the whole thing. Rewriting only leads to conflict with our state and national documents. The Constitution part should require very little. The Bylaws will depend on your unit. You must have the first two Bylaws as listed on the form, but the rest depend on your own unit/county. Some units vote on everything; some units spell out many of the usual activities and donations such as memorials for members who pass, money for attendance at conventions, etc., and yearly contributions to the Post or community. If you are writing your own part, be specific and be clear. Make sure that you are not just repeating what is included elsewhere, or, worse yet, contradicting a previous statement.

National has made three changes to their governing documents. The name of the audit committee has been changed to the Risk and Compliance committee (not something lower levels need to do), there is now an executive committee to the National Executive Committee, and the Executive Director will have check signing power. These changes do not require action on our parts. If you have questions about them, please contact me or check the National website.

Thank you to those who have updated their paperwork recently. Our governing documents need to be current and precise to avoid frustration and confusion when an issue comes up. You might consider adding the possibility of electronic meetings to your documents as we have had some issues this year with the pandemic stopping in person meetings. If your documents are thorough and up to date it will solve many of the questions that do not need to become contentious for us.

Welcome to a new administrative year under the leadership of Department President Mary Farley. We begin and start fresh each year with finance and all that comes with it. Your unit's yearly budget should be in place

and be voted upon for approval as soon as possible. Your budget is merely a "guideline" and items can be added with approval at any point in time.

As I began my Finance/Audit Chairmanship, I noted that the Department office had over 200 "outstanding checks" that had not been cashed. Some dated back to 2019. Obviously, with the pandemic, many units/counties did not meet, but deposits still should have been made for these checks. Some were made out to individuals for winnings on the Department calendar. Some were to counties for county membership dues portions. In fact, one county had "9" checks over the course of the past year for dues portions that had not been cashed totaling almost \$1,600. In an effort to "clean up the books", units/individuals will have until October 30, 2021, to cash/deposit checks that have been sent to them. After that date, those checks will be voided and no longer valid. <u>PLEASE</u> deposit/cash checks in a timelier manner. Many banks might not even honor these stale-dated checks. If that occurs, please contact Department Secretary Barbara Corker for a replacement check. Please remember to send back the outdated check so a new check can be issued.

Please remember to file your Unit Audit Data form by December 31, 2021, which can be found on the Department website or in your 21-22 Plan of Action.

Reminder: If you or someone you know are interested in applying to be on the Finance/Audit Committee for a 3-year term beginning with the 2022-2023 year, a letter of interest <u>and</u> resume are required to be submitted to the leading candidate for Department President by February 15, 2022.

Agenda for the 117th Congress (2021-2022)

Here are some listings of bills in progress. You can check the progress of these bills on the website <u>Congress.gov</u> by typing in the bill number in the search bar.

A bill to direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to designate one week each year as "Buddy Check Week" Act urging its members to continuously reach out to fellow veterans as one step toward reducing veteran suicides. S.544

A high percentage of post-9/11 veterans have been exposed to airborne toxic hazards, often the result of personal proximity to burn pits for extended times during service. The American Legion urges Congress to reintroduce and pass the Toxic Exposure in the American Military (TEAM) Act of 2020 and support further studies into conditions directly related to contaminants in order to establish a complete list of presumptive diseases caused by toxic exposure during service. H.R. 3967

U.S. Coast Guard personnel carry out daily missions vital to national security. They serve in the only military branch forced to work without pay during government shutdowns because of their status under the Department of Homeland Security. The American Legion urges Congress to reintroduce and pass the Pay Our Coast Guard Parity Act. This would guarantee that the Coast Guard personnel are paid without delay. S.1845

VA Caregiver Transparency Act – provide clarification and improvement of program of comprehensive assistance for family caregivers of the Dept. of Veterans Affairs. H.R. 4625

Suicide prevention assistance act – Amend the Public Health Service Act to establish a grant program to provide self-harm and suicide prevention services in primary care offices and for other purposes. The grant shall be used to hire more clinical social workers to carry out the activities such as screen patients for self-harm and suicide, provide patients short-term self-harm and suicide prevention services and to refer patients to a health care facility for purposes of receiving long-term self-harm and suicide prevention services. Parliamentarian...... Mary Lou Platt

There should be a Parliamentarian on every level of the American Legion Auxiliary. A Parliamentarian advises the President on various issues and matters of parliamentary procedure. The Parliamentarian does not rule. The President has the right to follow that advice or disregard it.

During the meeting, the Parliamentarian should be seated next to the President. The Parliamentarian speaks to the President and only speaks to the membership if the matter is complicated and then only at the request of the President.

Parliamentarians are not expected to know everything there is about Parliamentary Procedure, but it does help to understand the rules and regulations of the American Legion Auxiliary and the proper procedure for carrying them out.

The reason for having rules in the first place is to enable us to agree on the governance of our organization. Without rules, the American Legion Auxiliary would not last as a group. We wouldn't be able to avoid conflicts and we would experience disagreements on many issues without resolving them. We would find ourselves not knowing which rule takes precedence and when.

Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised is a wonderful resource for anyone who has to spend time in meetings.

Robert's Rules sets up some basic classifications to help avoid complications and to be able to keep discussion and action on a controversial issue from getting out of hand.

Your meetings will run smoother, shorter, and fairer by following:

- Courtesy & Justice to every member.
- Acting on only one thing at a time.
- The right of the minority to be heard.
- The rule of the majority to be recognized.

Warrior Family Assistance......Sally Johnston, Chairperson

Warriors Family Assistance (WFA) - What is it? What types of grants are available? Who can apply?

The WFA is a program unique to New York affording grants up to \$1200.00 to help our currently deployed military and their families and those honorably discharged within the last ten (10) years. The National Guard and Reservists who have been federally deployed within the past ten (10) years are also eligible. (Read more in your 2018 – 2022 Plan of Action or the 2021 – 2022 supplement also available on the department website www.deptny.org)

There are 3 types of Grants available.

MAINTENANCE - which includes cost of living, food, shelter to name a few.

MEDICAL – to help with the cost of current medical expenses and outstanding medical bills.

OPPORTUNITY FOR EMPLOYMENT GRANTS - assists in finding transportation to work and childcare if the custodial parent must find employment.

The above is a condensed overview of the program. At the request of our Department President Mary, she has asked that **ALL 62 County Presidents** appoint a WFA Chairman who can work the program. We must all take a part in letting our Veterans know that this program exists and how to apply for a grant.

If your Unit or your Post Home has a Stand Down, this would be a great time and place to have a table and display the WFA brochures and talk about the program. Regardless of what's going on around us in this world, we still have a responsibility to our currently serving service members and our Veterans as well.

We don't know what our nation is still facing with the "pandemic", but what we do know is how to serve our

Veterans. Would your Unit consider doing fundraiser for this program? Let's remember "why" we joined the American Legion Auxiliary and from whom we received our eligibility (dual members excluded). Let's make everyone in our "American Legion Family" and the public aware of this program. Ask your local merchants / doctors' offices / libraries, etc., if they would provide you with some space where you may display the WFA Brochures.
