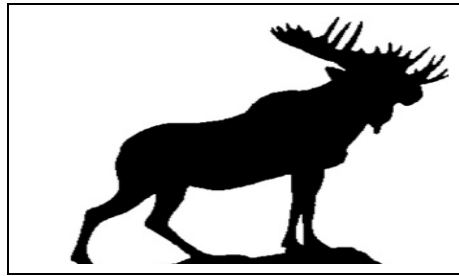

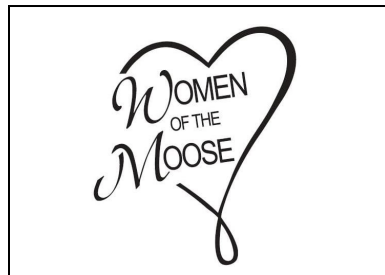

As your membership Committee chairman, I arm you with this information so that you can use it to greater strengthen OUR local herd and be prouder of the efforts of the nearly MILLION members we have as The Moose. As I said in my most recent membership reports, our top priority is to keep the members we have, remind them why we joined this Fraternity, and then grow organically with new membership prospects that understand who we are, what we do, why we do it, and wish to be a part of that effort. Personally, I think the entire world needs this more now than ever before.
