ADMINISTRATORS MESSAGE

I hope this message finds you well. We have a lot of happenings going on at the lodge. Currently my focus is on lodge improvements. While everyone knows my main goal is to get the parking lot done by July 2026, we have smaller tasks that needed to be completed as well. We are currently remodeling the men's bathroom that is in the game room and are hopeful this will be completed by the first week of September. Once that is complete, we will look at renovating all the other bathrooms, one at a time of course. We will be putting all new lighting in the hall and kitchen at the end of August so hopefully by the time you read this that project will be complete. The other projects that are coming are new lighting in the social guarters and new floors throughout the lodge home. We were lucky of enough to get approved for a lodge improvement grant for the parking lot of \$10,000 but as you know that is not nearly enough to cover the cost, but every bit helps. We also were approved for a lodge sign grant in the amount of \$3,000 so we will be getting a new sign soon. I am currently in the design phase. We have a design given to us by Moose International which is just a stock image. I hoping to have at least one of the sides of the sign personalized with a little bit of our character. You might be asking yourself how can I help? Well, this is how...by supporting our events, sharing your skills to help on a project or making donations to any of these projects. Also, if you have a fundraising idea let us know that as well. We hope to see you down at the lodge.

Membership Committee Report

Another important milestone has come this month from Moose International. On August 1, 2025, spouses of Moose members are required to join the Fraternity to continue to be a part of the activities and benefits that Moose members enjoy. This isn't a big deal for a lot of you who already have your own Moose card as the majority do. Holding that card shows you are solidly invested in the mission of the great Moose Fraternity, having sworn the obligation of membership when you signed your application to join the Moose. For that, we thank you.

I hope this letter finds you doing well! Over the last three years the lodge has made milestones and improvements around the lodge. We refinanced our loan with a lower interest rate and saved the lodge in the nick of time as we could not pay the balloon payment. We raised enough money to get our roof replaced and a new HVAC unit installed. We have installed new lighting around the outside of the building for the safety of our members. We replaced the Ansul system in the kitchen and had all fire systems in the building repaired and up to code. We were finally able to purchase the new sinks for behind the social quarters bar and got the new soda guns in. We also just did some painting of the lodge inside and out. Our last purchase, which will be installed by the beginning of May, is a new point of sale (POS) system for our lodge. As you noticed I said "WE" did this. This was a combined effort of our board, chairpersons and members who attend our events or send donations for various things. Without each one of you we could not have accomplished this.

Now that I have told you all the things we accomplished I must tell you about two other big projects that still need to be done. We are in dire need of a new parking lot. We are also in need of new floors throughout the building. The cost of the parking lot is going to cost about \$80k and the news floors \$45K. While we have been doing fundraising and will continue to do so this is a big expense. Our goal is to have this done before summer 2026. As it was just announced that we will be hosting the Moose International Cornhole Tournament in August of 2026. This tournament is a great opportunity for our lodge and will be a big weekend for us. While we wanted to get this done already this just puts some added fuel into the fire.

What does all this mean? **IT MEANS PLEASE WE NEED YOUR HELP**. We are currently averaging about 1300 members. If each member could donate \$100.00, we would be able to get the work done with a few other small upgrades. We do realize that \$100.00 is beyond some people's budget and we understand that. We just ask that you donate what you can as any amount is appreciated.


