

About White Cross

White Cross provides for direct and tangible participation in the compassionate care ministry of the Cameroon Baptist Convention, affiliated with the NAB. Churches and individuals are able to partner with them through the cutting and sewing of baby layettes (baby blanket, baby diaper and baby jacket), the rolling of bandages, the cutting of absorbent squares as well as in providing sheets, pillow cases and all manner of hospital and medical supplies.

Donations are packed into shipping containers and sent to the port of Douala, Cameroon where they are sorted and distributed among six mission hospitals as well as more than 75 health centers and clinics.

Although the primary focus of White Cross is on providing support to the compassionate care ministry of the medical work, many other tangible needs are being met through this ministry. Vital supplies for the supporting infrastructure of this work, including items for the guest houses and training efforts, are also coordinated through White Cross.

The work is shared by White Cross Canada and White Cross USA. Both are focused on supporting the needs in West Africa, and their efforts are coordinated with each other under the guidance of Cameroon Baptist Convention Health Services. Only items that will be useful in Cameroon are shipped.

A Growing Ministry

Maternal health is a key area of service in Cameroon, with dramatic improvements in the rate of infant mortality where CBCHS is active. Layettes, provided by volunteers in North America, are given to every mother and baby when available.





Cameroon Baptist Convention Health Services (CBCHS) continues to see dramatic growth in demand for its services. Shortages of needed items are not uncommon.

In many areas, facilities are being expanded and built as quickly as possible. In Banso, these nurses were taking their training in unfinished buildings (shown at right) because of space shortages.

Some Recent Examples of

Making a Difference – *Together*

Babies/Bandages/Community Development

For almost a century White Cross bandages and layettes for newborns have been staples that have helped health care workers in West Africa treat sickness and injury and save lives. Through an initiative known as Life Abundant Primary Health Care (LAP), community development efforts (including education, pre-natal/post-natal care, clean water and screening) have significantly improved health and life expectancy in rural areas.



Donations of Bedding and Other Supplies

Medical professionals and organizations in North America are increasingly supporting White Cross with donations of needed goods. One recent example is the gift of 4,300 new hospital bedsheets—filling nine pallets—which were surplus due to a small color variation. (In many African facilities, patients bring their own mattress and bedding into the hospital, but CBCHS is able to offer a healthier environment by providing clean bedding.) These types of donations, while a blessing, do present challenges such as temporary storage and shipping costs.

Operating Microscope – an example of High-Value Donations

The recent donation of a \$100,000 Moller-Wedel Surgical/Operating microscope (with floor stand, foot switch & camera/monitor attachments) has been a godsend for Dr. Jude Njikam, the head of Ophthalmology at Mboppi hospital in Douala. He treats 2,500 patients per month. This is an example of a new area of service for White Cross: large-scale donations of advanced equipment and surplus medical supplies. Through the



generosity of donors, these goods are able to be shipped to Cameroon.

deals with agencies and


Taylor Seminary in Edmonton,

White Cross – by the Numbers


These charts are based on combined figures from the Canadian and US offices, and are intended to provide a general outline of recent trends and developments.


