BEE HIVES

With a long-term goal of developing purposeful enterprises that makes the programs we run financially sustainable, we are piloting bees. The honey from one hive has the potential to educate two children for a year, provide jobs to women in the community and create an industry in the local area.



VISUAL LITERACY

What do you do when you walk into a classroom of children with no chalk, a blackboard so shiny it can barely be written on, and not enough desks for all children to sit down? You grab a piece of chalk from your classroom and do a visual literacy lesson. Then with those children, you laugh, connect and engage (while swallowing your own tears), and you leave them feeling valued, respected, and purposeful. And they may never know the gift they give you are priceless.









Hydroponics

Hydroponics have the power to change life in the ghettos. As we pilot this model in Kiserian our intention is to be in a position to run these lines up the back of our Korogocho school where there is no land to grow food and provide a farming program for children to eat lunch from.
