## Quick Word from us!

As 2021 nears its end, In2EdAfrica are feeling inspired and motivated by the success of the many purposeful enterprises we have operating.

Through collaborations we have succeeded in publishing the first of our children's books illustrated by the kids in Korogocho. Our schools in Kenya are growing in numbers. Aaliyah's period poverty project so far has 720 young girls in Kenya who have received their sanitary packs and menstrual health education. We have piloted collaborating with a teacher in Australia to teach reading to children in Kenya and our dance troop have already performed one concert with another set for December. We have also started a choir in Korogocho.

The team at In2EdAfrica have worked tirelessly this year, separated by thousands of miles from our projects and people and we have learned not to be seduced by a problem but rather to be activated by the solution.

# PERIOD POVERTY UPDATE

**Aaliyah who is one of our In2Ed Junior members raised enough money from her Little Lunches to buy three additional sewing machines and enough fabric to make almost 800 washable sanitary packs. That is almost 800 girls who now have access to uninterrupted education.**

The Young Australian of the Year invited Aaliyah to do work experience with her at her social enterprise Taboo, which she is still doing.
