


Governor Joseph Hiester Chapter Membership Drive at the Daniel Boone Homestead:

On June 21st our Chapter celebrated Allegiance Sunday by attending worship services at St. Michael's Church in Tilden Township. Following the service, there was a grave dedication ceremony held across the street in the church's graveyard. A marker was dedicated to Frederick Moyer Jr., (shown in upper left) who survived an indian attack in which his parents were killed on June 29, 1754. Moyer served in the Berks County Militia during the Revolutionary War. His marker is next to a memorial to Jacob Kauffman, a farmer and miller who raised Moyer after the attack. Children of the American Revolution

The Conrad Weiser Society is honored to host the 2015 PA C.A.R. Summer Workshop on August 8, 2015. Members and seniors (adult leaders) from across the state will gather at the Daniel Boone Homestead to tour the site and learn about the current State and National projects. After lunch, the group will be visited by Major General John Gronski, Commanding Officer, 28th Infantry Division, PA Army National Guard, who will give a presentation on leadership and good citizenship. In the evening, everyone will be enjoying themselves at the Reading Fightin' Phils game.

The current State Project of the PA Society is to raise funds to benefit the Milton Historical Society in the creation of the Gov. James Pollock gallery in the Cameron House Museum. Pollock was born in Milton in 1810 and made the town his home. He attended the College of New Jersey and established a law practice in Milton after graduation. In 1844, he was elected to the US House of Representatives and became good friends with Abraham Lincoln, with whom he shared a boarding room. While Lincoln was President, he appointed Pollock to head the US Mint and he is credited with adding the phrase "In God We Trust" to our currency. The phrase first appeared on the reverse of the 1864 2-cent coin. Pollock went on to become the 13th Governor of Pennsylvania and died in 1890.

The current National Project is to raise funds to benefit the Museum of the American Revolution for the conservation and display of Gen. George Washington's marguis tent in their "First Oval Office" display.
