

## Conrad Weiser Rememberance Ceremony

Members of the Gov. Joseph Hiester Color Guard participated in a joint event with the Patriotic Order Sons of America (“POS of A”) with a special ceremony on Sunday, October 18th. The Ceremony was held at the gravesite of Conrad Weiser at his Homestead in Womelsdorf to remember and honor him for his contributions to colonial Pennsylvania. Weiser was an 18th century German immigrant who served as an Indian interpreter and who helped coordinate Pennsylvania’s Indian policy.

*Veteran's Day Ceremony in City Park &  
Governor Joseph Hiester Ceremony*

On Wednesday, November 11<sup>th</sup>, Veteran's Day Ceremony at Veterans Grove, City Park, Reading. Service starts at 11AM.

Governor Joseph Hiester Wreath Laying Ceremony, at Charles Evans Cemetery, immediately after Veteran's Day Ceremony at City Park. We will meet at Charles Evans Cemetery, just inside the Main Gate, 1119 Center Ave., Reading, PA 19601 then proceed to the gravesite.

Gov Joseph Hiester was a Captain in the militia and later captured at the Battle of Long Island while most of his compatriots were wounded or killed. He was sent to the HMS Jersey Prison Ship and eventually transferred to New York in a prisoner exchange. He also participated in the Battle of Germantown.

He was a member of the convention of 1776 that drafted the Articles of Confederation, of the Pennsylvania state constitutional convention which ratified the United States Constitution, and of the state constitutional convention of 1790. He served in the house (1787–1790) and the senate (1790–1794) of Pennsylvania. In 1807, he was appointed one of the two major generals to command the quota of Pennsylvania militia that was called for by the president. He served in the United States House of Representatives from 1797 until 1805, and again from 1815 until 1820, 14 years altogether. In 1817, he ran for governor, only to be defeated by William Findlay. Hiester faced Findlay again in 1820 and narrowly won a single term in office. Refusing on principle to stand for reelection in 1823, he served until 1824 when he retired from public life. During his term, he presided over the dedication of the first state capitol building in the new capital of Harrisburg. He surprised partisans and opponents by making appointments strictly on merit rather than party affiliation.

W. James Schucker Jr. grew up in Lebanon, served in the Navy. He attended the University of Hawaii and received his Bachelor's Degree from Lebanon Valley College. He later studied at Penn State and received a Master's degree from Millersville University. Jim retired from the Lebanon School District in 2000 after 36 years of service. Mr. Schucker has served as Secretary of the Lebanon County Historical Society for 25 years and on the Board for 35 years. Jim has been active in the Friends of the Union Canal Tunnel Park since it was organized in 1994 serving as the Chairman of Park Development and overseeing the restoration of the North Side of the park. He was the Treasurer for about 16 years and is now serving as their President. He helps maintain the park and serves as the Historian of the organization. Mr. Schucker is also serving as President of St. Marks U.C.C. Congregation in Lebanon, Pa.

A regular lecturer at Mount Vernon's Fred W Smith National Library for the Study of George Washington. The topic of his talk, *'I walk on untrodden ground', George Washington and the Forging of the Presidency*. Dr. Pearl has graciously accepted our invitation to be the speaker at our 2nd. Annual George Washington's Birthday Luncheon, at the Berkshire Country Club.

**Dr. Pearl specializes in Early American History and is an expert of Colonial and Revolutionary America.** He has published scholarly articles on the origins of the American Revolution, the significance of religion in the causes and consequences of the American Revolution, and the American Revolution as a process of the state formation and is currently working on a book exploring the American Revolution in Pennsylvania entitled, *Forged in Crisis: The American Revolution and the Creation of a Commonwealth.*

*Dr. Pearl received his PhD from Binghamton University, his MA from Brockport University, and his BA from St. John Fisher College.*

*Dr. Pearl has received 11 research grants from organizations and places such as the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation and the David Library of the American Revolution.*

# Revolutionary War 1775 - 1783

- U.S. troops engaged: 217,000
- American battle deaths: 4,435
- The 13 American colonies fought for independence from British rule to become the United States.
- Colonists were frustrated because Britain forced them to pay taxes, yet did not give them any representation in the British Parliament. Colonists rallied behind the phrase, “no taxation without representation.”
- The first shots rang out on the morning of April 19, 1775 in Lexington, Mass.
- At the Battle of Bunker Hill, colonial officer William Prescott ordered, “Do not fire until you see the whites of their eyes!” His troops had the courage and discipline to hold their fire until the enemy was near, an early sign that the rag-tag American army had a chance at defeating the well-trained, well-armed British troops.
- Congress chose George Washington as commander and chief of America's armed forces.
- The Battle of Saratoga was the first great American victory of the war and is widely believed to have been the turning point that led America to triumph over Britain.
- The Treaty of Paris was signed in 1783, and Great Britain acknowledged America's independence. The treaty established a northern boundary with Canada and set the Mississippi River as the western boundary.

### BRITISH FORCES

133,000 troops comprised the British Forces at the height of the war.

56,000 REGULAR BRITISH SOLDIERS

30,000 GERMAN AUXILIARIES (primarily Hessians)

13,000 NATIVE AMERICANS

19,000 LOYALISTS

96,500 troops served in the Continental Army at the height of the war.

35,000 REGULAR ARMY SOLDIERS

5,000 SAILORS

45,000 MILITIAMEN

12,000 FRENCH

As many as 25,000 slaves and freed blacks fought on both sides of the war.

1,546 Military engagements throughout the war.

George Washington led the Continental Army in the 5 biggest battles, but only 1 was a decisive victory—the Battle of Yorktown in 1781.

December 19, 1777 ★ VALLEY FORGE ★ June 19, 1778

At least 2,000 of them died there, 2/3 from diseases like influenza, dysentery, typhus and typhoid.

Approximately 11,000 troops made their winter quarters at Valley Forge. Washington used the time to improve army training and discipline, which helped turn the tide of the war.

During the 6-month encampment engineers built 2,000 huts, miles of trenches and even a bridge.

### THE AFTERMATH

At least 50,000 soldiers died during the war.

24,000 British troops died – 3,500 in battle

1,700 Loyalist soldiers died, and 70,000 Loyalists fled the American colonies after the war.

1,200 German mercenaries died—but 20 percent of those who survived stayed in the United States.

25,000 Colonial troops died – 4,435 in battle

Disease killed off at least 10,000 American troops.

18,000 Colonial soldiers were captured and 10,000 of these POWs died.

Colonial soldiers were 3X more likely to die on British prison ships than in battle.
