
Allegiance Sunday





Constitution 225th Anniversary

PASSAR is celebrating the 225th anniversary of the signing of the Constitution with a gathering of compatriots from across the country on September 14 & 15. The gathering will be at the Double Tree Hotel at 301 West DeKalb Pike, King of Prussia.

On Friday, September 14, there will be an informal buffet dinner starting at 6:30 PM where you can meet and chat with compatriots from all over.

On Saturday, September 15, the Guardsmen will head into Philadelphia for a parade which will form up opposite the Liberty Bell Pavilion and proceed to Chestnut Street in front of Independence Hall where there will be a brief SAR ceremony. From there, the parade march to the front of the Constitution Center for the speaker and program.

All uniformed Color Guard members, including those without a unit, are welcome to march in the parade. Members' ladies who are dressed in colonial garb are also welcome to march.

Any person affiliated with SAR who is registered at the hotel or signed up for the buffet and banquet may ride the buses that will be provided for transportation.
