2nd Lt. Zachary Railing is assigned as a Platoon Leader in Ammunition that is part of the Ordinance Branch of the Army. He currently puts in a long day, getting up at 4am to lead his platoon in PT. The other two lieutenants he works with have not received their cars from the US yet, so he has been driving them to and from work, so he does not get home until around 8pm. This month he is working on taking physical inventory.

Zach is now living in an apartment on the third floor in the town of Weiden, Germany. He has a nice apartment with two bedrooms, kitchen, living room, bathroom with laundry room and an outside storage room where he keeps his bike. His apartment is only a fifteen minute walk to catch the train to Nuremburg. Nuremburg has the largest Christmas market in Germany. People come from all over Europe to shop and enjoy the huge Christmas market and displays. Zach absolutely loves the German countryside, old buildings and castles. Whenever he can, he goes sightseeing on the weekends.

One of Zach's fellow officers is friends with a German family from when his father was stationed in Germany. Zach was invited to their home on Christmas Eve for the traditional German meal of pork roast, potato salad, peas and carrots, potato balls (shredded potatoes that you split open and pour gravy on). It is their tradition to celebrate on Christmas Eve. On Christmas Day the German family took him to see a castle that is hidden and not well known except by the local people. The castle was built in 1200 and has been owned by the same family for over 800 years.


Honoring Conrad Weiser





Eagle Scout Committee Report




