

Brandywine Revolutionary Times

Guardsman Raymond Longacre attended the September 7th event commemorating the 231st anniversary of the Battle of Brandywine and offers this report:

A table was manned by PASSAR Graves Registration Chairman, James H. Willis (incoming President of the P-CC), Joseph R. Stokes and myself. We answered questions concerning Revolutionary War patriot grave registration and those specific to membership. There was good interaction with the Chester County Chapter of the DAR, located two tables away.

There were encampments of Colonials, English and Germans and sutlers selling their wares. There were exhibitions on the use equipment, weapons and military tactics. The battle re-enactment went off without a hitch although with no change in the final result.

Hopewell Furnace



The Color Guard was invited to Hopewell Furnace National Historical Park on August 2nd to participate in their Fueling the Furnace event. Chapter guardsmen Raymond Longacre, Bruce Reppert and Nevin Miller were reinforced by Phil Anders and Dick Randolph of the Philadelphia Continental Chapter. Hopewell Furnace started operation in 1771 and produced cannon during the Revolutionary War.

Revolutionary War Monument Update

We have received approval of our second \$5,000 grant from the Community Revitalization Program. We also have requests pending for 2 more grants as well as the grant requested by the Conrad Weiser Society, C.A.R.

The city's Planning Commission has recommended that the Penns Common Community Group, the organization that put together the City Park Master Plan, review the proposal and forward their comments to City Council who has the final say on whether or not we may put the monument in City Park. This is the first monument proposal since the approval of the City Park Master Plan and, as such, is being scrutinized more than similar requests in the past.

The monument will be a smooth, grey granite obelisk, 10 feet tall, 2 feet wide at the base and 1 1/2 feet wide near the peak. The inscription will read: "To the Patriots of Berks County who served the Cause of Liberty in the War for American Independence—1775—1783 Erected in the 233rd year of American Independence—2009"

Other sites for the monument may need to be considered or we may need to find an appropriate person or persons to lobby on our behalf.
