- 1. Enter the Patriot and Grave Index (http://patriot.sar.org) and input "Index" in the box labeled Full or Partial Surname and then click the SEARCH box.
- 2. Patriot Index with Ancestor # P-334038 will come up. Click on the "Read Biography" box in the lower left corner of the page to access the listing of biographies in the data base.

Veteran's Day Ceremony at Veteran's Grove, City Park, Reading, PA

The Combined Veterans Council of Berks County hosted a service at City Park, Reading, PA on November 11th at 11:00am (the day, date and time of the armistice that ended World War I in 1918), with several hundred spectators in attendance. U.S. Representative Ryan Costello, a Berks and Chester County Republican, who also serves on the House Veterans Affairs Committee spoke to the audience regarding the sacrifices made by veterans and how "Our nation's values are reflected in your courage and sacrifice." County Commissioners Chairman Christian Y. Leinbach also addressed the audience followed by Marine Corps veteran and co-founder of Keystone Wounded Warriors Paul Spurgin, who was the keynote speaker. Mr. Spurgin spoke to the audience about our military who are serving on the front lines to defend the freedom of this country.

Our Chapter Color Guard participated in the event, serving alongside the Reading High School JROTC Color Guard with the presentation of colors. Representatives of veterans groups and Berks County laid about a dozen floral wreaths at war memorials. In the upper right photo below, Chapter President Leon E. Following the event, our Chapter also presented a wreath by the SAR/DAR Revolutionary War Monument to pay tribute to our nation's first veterans (shown in lower left photo below).

Gov. Joseph Hiester Gravesite Ceremony at Charles Evans Cemetery

Our Chapter held its first Annual Gravesite Ceremony on Veteran's Day to pay tribute to Gov. Joseph Hiester for his contributions to the Revolutionary War and to Pennsylvania. Floyd N. Turner II and Chapter President gave remarks about Berks County native Gov. Hiester and his involvement in the Revolutionary War most notably during the Battle of Long Island, the Battle of Germantown and a tour onboard the prisoner of war ship HMS Jersey. He later represented Berks County in serving four years in the State Senate and fourteen years in the House. Joseph Hiester went on to become the 5th Governor of Pennsylvania. A Wreath was presented to his gravesite.

Wreaths Across America, Indiantown Gap National Cemetery, Annville, PA

Our Chapter's Color Guard participated in the 2015 Wreaths Across America ceremony along with over 40 other organizations on December 12th in Annville, Pa. at the Indiantown Gap National Veterans Cemetery. Over 3,000 people attended to pay tribute and remember veterans for their sacrifice. The S.A.R., active duty military, veterans, family, friends and others helped to lay approximately 9,200 wreaths. Floyd N. Turner II was Master of the Ceremony and Major General James R. Joseph was the keynote speaker and is currently serving as the 52nd Adjutant General of Pennsylvania and Commander of the Pennsylvania National Guard. The ceremony included an aircraft flyover, the placement of ceremonial wreaths and the recognition of approximately three dozen Gold Star Mother's who lost a son or daughter while serving on active duty.

Mr. Mike Elmer & his horse Duke presented the Riderless Horse for the fallen warriors. The ceremony came to a close with a Rifle Volley, Echo Taps and the retirement of Colors.

Dr. Pearl specializes in **Early American History and is an expert of Colonial and Revolutionary America.** He has published scholarly articles on the origins of the American Revolution, the significance of religion in the causes and consequences of the American Revolution, and the American Revolution as a process of the state formation and is currently working on a book exploring the American Revolution in Pennsylvania entitled, *Forged in Crisis: The American Revolution and the Creation of a Commonwealth.*

Dr. Pearl received his PhD from Binghamton University, his MA from Brockport University, and his BA from St. John Fisher College.

Michael Harris is a graduate of the University of Mary Washington and the American Military University. He worked for the National Park Service in Fredericksburg, Virginia, Fort Mort State Park in New Jersey, and the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission at Brandywine Battlefield. He has conducted tours and staff rides of many battlefields, especially the above mentioned parks and battlefields. He is also a certified secondary teacher and teaches in the Philadelphia region. Michael lives in Pennsylvania with his wife, Michelle and son, Nathanael.

Having purchased and read his book, I was amazed to find it full of small details and facts but at the same time you do not get lost in the book and actually, I was looking for more detail as I was reading.
