The house belonged to John Neville who served during the Revolutionary War and was promoted to Brigadier General. After the war John was a tax collector and was a key figure in the Whiskey Rebellion.

The National Project continues and is to benefit the Star Spangled Banner House in Baltimore, Maryland. Mary Pickersgill made the large flag for Fort McHenry. The home is now a museum. There are a number of flag poles around the building but many of them have no flags as the polls are in need of repair and there is no money in the budget.
