Meet your guides in the Reception area of your hotel and spend the afternoon on a private guided tour of the world-famous Louvre Museum.

In the company of your guides, explore the museum and its vast collection, ranging from Egyptian antiquities to 19th-century paintings and decorative arts. Stop to admire the iconic *La Gioconda* (Mona Lisa) and *Nike of Samothrace* (Winged Victory) and discover lesser-known treasures, including sculptures, prints, drawings, and artifacts from ancient civilizations.

Walk back to your hotel (5 minutes) at the end of the experience for a quick change and refresh before your dinner.

Meet your driver in the Reception area of your hotel and upon arrival at the Eiffel Tower, meet your host and discover the charm of the Tower with a luxurious yet relaxed experience that combines history, storytelling, and fine dining.

Seated at a window table (*subject to availability*), the City of Light awaits you: the intimacy of this space as well as the unique view, as close as possible to the Seine and the Trocadéro gardens, guarantees you a moment out of time. As you enjoy your three-course dinner, your guide will weave fascinating stories about the Eiffel Tower's history and its legendary architect, Gustave Eiffel. From the intriguing tale of the elephant who climbed partway up the structure to the telegraph that helped convict Mata Hari, your historian guide will bring the Tower's past to life with entertaining anecdotes and visual props, including a rare 50-franc note featuring Eiffel's portrait.

After your meal, take a leisurely walk around the terrace with your host, exploring the panoramic views while spotting landmarks such as the Statue of Liberty replica and beyond. At the end of the evening, meet your drivers for your private luxury transfer back to your hotel.

The United States formally entered World War I on April 6th, 1917. By the time the war finally ended, on November 11, 1918, more than 2 million American soldiers had served on the battlefields of Western Europe, and some 50,000 of them had lost their lives. Meet your guide and driver in the Reception area of your hotel and set off on a memorable journey as you trace the footsteps of American soldiers in World War I, *following an itinerary suggested by your guide based on venue opening hours, your interests, and time available.*

Begin with a visit to the Museum of the Great War in Meaux, taking an in-depth look at the conflict and America's entry in 1917. Continue to Château-Thierry, a key site of the 1918 Marne battles. Visit the Hill 204 American Monument and the Quentin Roosevelt exhibit, then drive to Croix Rouge Farm, where Roosevelt was killed. Explore the haunting Belleau Wood—scene of fierce Marine combat—and walk among the preserved trenches and memorials. Visit the Aisne-Marne American Cemetery nearby, final resting place of over 2,200 soldiers, with a touching Memorial Chapel and Wall of the Missing. Lunch is at leisure along the route (not included).

Return to Paris with your driver and guide in the late afternoon; evening at your leisure.

Monday, 03 November

Meet your guides and drivers in the Reception area of your hotel and take a journey back to Paris in wartime.

Begin your tour with the Arc of Triomphe and the Champs Élysées, where the Germans entered on 14 June 1940; eight days later, France accepted defeat, along with foreign Occupation. Learn about the everyday life of Parisians during the Occupation, the plight of the Jews, and the round-ups. Explore the Jewish quarter with its famous rue des Rosiers, and discover the Gestapo Headquarters in the 8th arrondissement and other sites related to the Occupation. *Optionally*, learn about the Resistance fighters and relive the last days of the Liberation—a critical and complicated period not only in the history of Paris but also in the history of the Second World War—during a visit of the Museum of the Order of the Liberation.

Your drivers will drop you off at your lunch venue at the end of the experience.
