

The Medical & Engineering Graduates Welfare Association of Sindh (MEG-WAS) was established on 21st May 1997 and it was registered on 10th October 2003 under the voluntary Social Welfare Agencies (Registration & Control) ordinance 1961 (XI, VI of 1961) of Sindh province.

The primary objective was to establish an association that caters to the needs of Doctors and Engineers who face immense challenges, including deteriorating working conditions, in the province. Despite their crucial roles, the professionals in these fields continue to grapple with unresolved issues, such as unemployment, limited foreign scholarship opportunities, inadequate service structure, delayed promotions, and insufficient technical allowances. Furthermore, they face low monthly salaries, inadequate medical compensation, and health insurance, as well as limited access to housing societies, clubs and academic resources.

Vision:

Our vision is to support doctors and engineers by addressing their key challenges, ultimately enabling them to deliver exceptional service and drive excellence in Pakistan's medical and engineering sectors.

Mission:

Our mission is to foster a highly motivated and skilled workforce of doctors and engineers, equipping them to make meaningful contributions and bring positive impact within their respective medical and engineering communities.

Our Values:

At the core of our organization lie the values of dedication, love, peace, and harmony, which guide our pursuit of justice and equality. We uphold the principles of self-responsibility, transparency, and accountability, fostering a culture of trust, integrity, sincerity and equality to bring positive change in the society.



The aims and objectives of MEGWAS were very clearly spelt out from day one, they include main things like, organizing the Sindh Doctors and Engineers on one platform to achieve peace, tranquility, harmony and self-sufficiency amongst Sindh Doctors, Engineers and others.

These aims and objectives also include taking efforts towards achieving better education, health, economy and environment for medical and engineering graduates of Sindh.

The Aims and objectives of the organization are as follow:

- 1) To organize, unite and consolidate the Professional Graduates of Sindh.
- 2) To help the Professional Graduates in the problems resolving to their employments.
- 3) To establishe cooperative housing society for members of the organization.
- **4)** To Co-operate and federate with other organizations of Sindh having noble objectives especially of human rights improvements.

 - ii) To organize literary sittings with renowned poets, intellectuals and heroes of Sindh.
 - **iii)** To celebrate the Birth Anniversaries of all-time great Personalities of Sindh, like Shah Abdul Latif, Sachal Sarmast, Sami, Makhdoom Bilawal, Z.A. Bhutto, G.M. Syed, Gulam Mustafa Shah etc.
 - iv) To publish periodicals/Newspapers/E-papers for the Association.

Past Performance of Organization

The organization right from beginning has been taking interest in the social, economic and upliftment activities in Sindh and their impact has been marvelous. 8. A free medical camp was held at Dargah Lakiyari Hingorja, Taluka Sobhodero, District Khairpur (Mirs), on Sunday, February 02, 2025. It was inaugurated by Syed Kazim Ali Shah, Senator, Pakistan. In this medical camp, the number of beneficiaries in terms of OPDs was 4,500.





















9. A free medical camp was held at Ghazi Goth, Karachi, in special collaboration with Makli Welfare Organisation on Sunday, February 23, 2025. It was inaugurated by Nisar Ahmed Khohiro, MPA, Sindh. During this camp, a total of 1,900 beneficiaries received medical consultations (OPDs).


H - Research Findings and Publications

- VI. Liaise between different medical and engineering organizations for adjustment of low-er-level technical cadre and support them in this regard.
- **VII.** Skill development and vocation training: Establish vocational training centers, empowering people to secure employment and improve their livelihoods. Starting livelihood enhancement programs launching the projects focused on agricultural development, micro enterprise support or providing small loans to encourage entrepreneurship and sustainable income generation among disadvantaged communities.
- **VIII.** Community infrastructure development: Collaborate with local authorities to construct or renovate community facilities such as schools, health clinics, or community centers to enhance access to essential services.
- **IX.** Technology and digital inclusion: Launching of projects to bridge the digital divide by providing access to the technology, internet connectivity and digital literacy training, especially in rural and less developed areas.
- **X.** Advocacy and Policy development: Engage in advocacy efforts to influence policy making and implementation process related to social welfares and poverty alleviation at the provincial, district levels and town levels.
