DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- When traveling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free-flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire result. Please look after your dog's welfare.

FOULING BY DOGS

ANY OWNER, EXIBITOR, HANDLER OR OTHER PERSON IN CHARGE OF A DOG IS REQUIRED TO REMOVE ANY FOULING CAUSED BY THEIR DOG(S) AT ANY KENNEL CLUB LICENCED SHOW WITHIN THE LICENSED VENUE AND WITHIN THE ENVIRONS OF THAT EVENT INCLUDING CAR AND CARAVAN PARKS AND APPROACHES.

ANY ORGANISATION HOLDING A KENNEL CLUB LICENSED EVENT IS REQUIRED TO PROIDE AN ADEQUATE NUMBER OF RECEPTACLES FOR THE DISPOSAL OF SUCH FOULING.

EXHIBITORS PLEASE NOTE: In accordance with the new Kennel Club guidelines. Exhibitors must display exhibit number/owner identification on their crate, cage or container at all times.

All dogs are to be kept under the full control of their owner or handlers at ALL times.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The Show will open at 09.00 am.
2. Dogs will be received until 10.00 am, after which no dogs may be received except under unforeseen and exceptional circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management.
3. Judging will commence at 10.00 am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting & benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. Entry Fees: £5.00 first entry per dog. Subsequent entries same dog: £1.00 per class. N.F.C: 50p. Stakes Class: £1.00 per entry. Membership: £9.00 Single; £10.00 Joint; £13.00 Family (to reside at same address); £15.00 Overseas; £5.00 Joining Fee.
7. Rosettes for 1st, 2nd, 3rd, Reserve. There will be no Prize money awarded.
8. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries or advertisements.
9. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition. (Puppies 4 months of age and over may be entered Not For Competition)
10. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW:** Where a Best Puppy in Show is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed & is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the

same Show. A puppy is a dog of six & not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a Puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.

Withdrawal from other competition

Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

PROVISO: For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dogs, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace & Team or a Special Award confirmed to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.

12. **BEST IN SHOW:** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed & is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex provided they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

WITHDRAWAL FROM COMPETITION: Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than Breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show & Reserve Best in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.

PROVISO: For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dogs, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace & Team

or a Special Award confirmed to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.

13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best n Show competition after a period of 10 minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Manager.
14. Exhibitors must not pick up a dog by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulations F11.
15. It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulations F11.
16. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition
17. All dog's resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

19. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
20. No modification will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the canine press wherever possible.
21. The Show will be held under Kennel Club Limited Rules and Show Regulations. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries at this show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by these Rules and Regulations and it is on this understanding that entries are received.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

In the following definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won all wins up to & including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **29th August 2019**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering for Variety

classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First prize does not include a Special prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options: -

1. **Withdrawal** – The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) & 20.

1) **Transfer** –

a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class. Minor Puppy & Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

b) If an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under 12 calendar months, 18 calendar months of age or 24 calendar months respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

c) For any reason other than above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.

d) If an exhibitor arrives late & misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may **NOT** be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

- SPECIAL NEWCOMER:** For owner, handler and exhibit not having won more than one CC or Reserve CC at any Show.
- NOVICE:** For Dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First prizes at Open & Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy & Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).
- POST GRADUATE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit or Open Classes, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
- LIMIT:** For dogs which have not become Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won seven or more First prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.
- OPEN:** For all dogs of the Breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at this Show.
- VETERAN:** For dogs of not less than seven years of age and over on the 1st day of the Show.
- NOT FOR COMPETITION:** For any dog of any breed but must be registered with the Kennel Club. This includes puppies between the age of 4 to 6 months. **Regulation F.1.e.** Only dogs of six calendar months of age and over on the first day of the show are eligible for exhibition at Kennel Club licensed shows. However, societies may accept Not for Competition entries at their discretion and dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Not for Competition at **all Kennel Club licensed Shows**. Furthermore, dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Match Competitions.

Regulations For The Preparation of Dogs For Exhibition F (Annex B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
2.
 - a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed.
 - c) Operations to prevent breeding, provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class, and objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection of the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.
