In his home, Rob had a picture of himself and “SBG” sitting together while watching cartoons. It is a photograph, that we now cherish, of two people that we love and miss so much.

After Grace passed away, Rob became a passionate supporter of the Sweet Pea Foundation. In our early years, Rob would accompany me to hospitals and Ronald McDonald Homes to deliver toys and other items needed by these organizations. He helped us create and implement the Blarney Bash, one of our annual fundraisers that took place on St. Patrick’s Day for ten years. He also organized our first golf outing, calling it the Kickoff Classic—an annual event that we continue today.

There are countless other ways that Rob supported and assisted us with the Sweet Pea Foundation. His love and passion for helping those in need, especially sick children, is evident in everything that Rob did for the Foundation.

Reflecting back on this past year, I not only mourn the loss of my brother, but my best friend. I think about Rob every day. I encourage you reach out to your family and friends and let them know how important they are to you.
