We need to thank all the scientists, researchers, doctors, nurses, and the companies that have been dedicated to working on treatments and vaccines to prevent the spread of the virus. In just nine short months, the FDA issued the first emergency use authorization for a vaccine for the prevention of the Coronavirus disease.

This is a remarkable achievement!

Remarkable achievements like this are happening all the time in the field of medicine and we need to thank God for medical progress that saves or improves the lives of those afflicted.

Like the medical breakthrough for Covid 19, there are treatments today for Spinal Muscular Atrophy, SMA for short, that took Graces' life.

Many don't know that SMA is a genetic disorder that starts in the central nervous system and affects all the muscles in the body. It's caused by a lack of spinal motor neuron proteins that are key in muscle development and movement. Due to the degenerative nature of the disease, people with SMA will experience a decline in muscle strength over time. The rate and severity differs among individuals and in Grace's case, she had the most severe subtype—Type 1, early-onset SMA

Over 18 years ago, when Grace was born, there were no treatments available. Now, parents have options to help their children diagnosed with SMA. We appreciate all the professionals dedicated to studying genetic diseases of all kinds. They are truly creating life changing and remarkable results that offers hope for those who are affected.

Thank you for supporting the Sweet Pea Foundation. It is because of Grace, our little Sweet Pea, that we started this Foundation and made it our mission to help sick children and their families!

idea the impact these refrigerators are having with the restricted movement of families in the hospital [due to Covid]. Families can only come and go once a day so a mom can pump several times and have plenty of room for all of the milk, and there is peace of mind that the temperature is accurate with the digital display. Thank you so much for doing this for our families, it is very much appreciated. When a child is sick, the greatest gift we can give is the love and strength of family."
