



## Outlook Express version 6.0 airHOP email setup


1. Open Outlook Express, from the **Tools** menu, select **Accounts**.



2. Click on the **Add** button and select **Mail**.




3. In the **Display name** box , type in the name you want displayed. Click **Next**.





5. Make sure **POP3** is selected from the **My incoming mail server is** drop-down menu. In both the **Incoming & Outgoing mail server** boxes, type in **mail.airhop.com**. Click **Next**.


Incoming mail (POP3, IMAP or HTTP) server:
