VA HOSPITAL VISITATION TEAM

Ladies and Gentlemen

Once again I bring you news of the wonderful world of the Veteran's Hospital visits. We have a dedicated group of about 8 people who make it a point of showing up to visit the Vets every second and fourth Tuesday of the month around 2PM. We divide the group up into three smaller groups and take turns visiting the three areas of the complex that we go to.

One of the areas are the "Green Houses". They are residential living spaces for the older Veterans who have no where else to go and still need medical treatments from time to time. They can be compared to assisted living areas. The people there are always happy to see us and are eager to tell us stories of their service adventures. Some of them lead very interesting lives.

Another area is building 134. These floors are rooms that house veterans that need daily care but with varying degrees of medical problems. These areas can be compared to nursing homes. The people are still able to get out and around on their own to some extent but need to have daily care that they could not get if they were living in their own homes. It is hit or miss with these wards as the vets are able to go out and about at will so we never know if they will be there or not.

The last area is building 133. This is the "Hospital" area of the complex. There are active duty personnel, dependents, and vets from all branches of the service. While visiting there the last couple times we noticed an unusually high number of Navy Recruits being treated for various ailments. These people are really amazed that we would take time to visit with them. They tell us up front that they are just starting their service time and find it hard to believe that we would come visit them when they are sick or injured. They really enjoy our visits.

This past week we went into a room of a Navy vet from Vietnam. He has many serious medical problems and is not always able to communicate with his wife, family, and the nursing staff. His brother, sister, brother-in-law, and wife were all there this week. We had a great visit with them as we have seen them from time to time in the last month or so. Before we left the wife had to thank each of us for visiting. She said she was also very thankful that we do what we do. She said that she is not always able to visit her husband as often as she would like but she knows that he is not forgotten and that people like our group give her comfort when she is not able to visit, knowing that we take the time to visit and spend a few minutes with all the patients no matter what they have wrong. We all walked away from that room feeling a little better for having been there for someone who truly appreciates and needs people that do what we do.

We encourage all of you to come out at least once to see what we do and meet some of the wonderful Veterans in our hospital. You do not need to be a member of our team to visit. If you decide you would like to join our team we would be glad to have you.
