Joining us on the 15th will be three outstanding Marines who will share with us a few 'sea stories'.

Jim King served five years as a Marine aviator and served a year in Vietnam in 1969/70. Jim was in VMA (AW) 225 in Danang and flew the Grumman A-6 Intruder. Jim King flew 215 combat missions in Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia. Jim left the Corps as a Captain. His career was in commercial real estate.

Col Jim Homan was one of King's squadron-mates and is one of our Det. 801 Eagle Scout presenters. Col Jim Homan flew in the right seat as the bombarder / navigator on the A-6 Intruder in 1969/70 during Vietnam with 250 combat missions. Col Homan stayed in the reserves and served in Iraq with the Corps. Jim worked for a number of major corporations over seas in security.

Bud Green is 93. After serving in the Marine Corps as a First Lieutenant with an Engineering MOS, Bud became the owner of Dearborn Wire and Cable in Chicago. At age 59 in 1991, he offered to re-enlist and was turned down by Headquarters USMC.

It will be an interesting to hear what these three veterans will share with us.

The Wall That Heals is a three-quarters scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial along with a mobile Education Center. The traveling exhibit honors the more than three million Americans who served in the U.S. Armed Forces in the Vietnam War and it bears the names of more than 52,281 men and women who made the ultimate sacrifice in Vietnam. Visitors experience The Wall rising above them as they walk towards the apex, a key feature of the design of The Wall in D.C. Like the original memorial, The Wall That Heals is erected in a chevron-shape and visitors can do name rubbings of individual service member's names. Modern LED lighting provides readability of The Wall Day and Night.


WELCOME ABOARD
