10-16--

We were contacted by Andy at the VAC about a Sailor, Jack Coombe, had passed away at the age of 97. He was married for 70 years and his wife passed away last year. They did not have any kids and there would be no relatives at the wake.

He was in the Navy, Our Navy, from 1940 until 1946. He was a Pearl Harbor survivor and was with the fleet at the invasions of the Solomon Islands, Saipan, Iwo Jima and Okinawa. In those days, deployment was for the duration, not 6 months as it is now.

Peter Karlovics, Richard Butler, Commandant Pedrin and I attended the Wake. We conducted Casket guard and gave our final salute.

10-19--

We fired a Volley At the Dedication of a Memorial to Honor the 74 Seamen killed aboard the USS Evans. Warren Cemetery donated the space, monument and money to erect the Monument.

USS FRANK E. EVANS (DD 754) departed Long Beach, CA for Westpac on 29 March 1969. She was ordered to Yankee Station, the "Gun Line", as a naval gun-fire support ship between 5 May and 15 May during Operation Daring Rebel. She responded to 86 calls for gunfire support, expending over 5,000 rounds of ammunition in support of the South Vietnamese, South Korean, and US Marine Corp troops that were fighting on the ground. On leaving the gun line, EVANS proceeded to Subic Bay and Manila to rearm and prepare for a Southeast Asia Treaty Organization (SEATO) exercise. On 26 May 1969, she departed Manila in the screen of the Australian antisubmarine warfare carrier HMAS MELBOURNE (R 21). In the early morning darkness on 3 June 1969, during maneuvers of taking up plane guard station 1,000 yards astern of MELBOURNE, EVANS crossed in front of the carrier and MELBOURNE cut the EVANS in half. Seventy-four (74) men lost their lives. The names of the "lost 74" sailors are not inscribed upon the Vietnam Memorial Wall in Washington DC because, according to the Department of Defense, they were killed outside the "Combat Zone."
