COMMANDANT'S COMMENTS

I begin this message to all of you today with a heavy heart. Our Country had been involved in a terrible situation that has not been heard of before in our lifetime. We are on the verge of a great pandemic that will have repercussions for many months and possibly years to come. We have not had a devastating disease sweep this Country like this since the great influenza epidemic in the 1917- 1918 era. During that time there were many thousands of people all across the Country that died and created a National panic.

Today we are dealing with a flu type virus similar to the one that killed so many people in the early 1900's but this crisis is a lot different that the prior one. This virus has no known cure at this time. This is causing many medical departments and the Country at large to question our actions for the next month. This is the reason for the tight domestic restrictions being placed on us at this time.

I am hoping and praying that none of us in the detachment, nor our relatives fall victim to this dreadful disease. I have seen the idiots on TV partying on the beaches and saying that they were not afraid of the virus. I then saw several days later that a large number of the dame people were stricken with the same illness. I hope that none of you are as bold as some of the partiers seen on TV. We have been asked to shelter in place as much as possible and to keep 6 feet away from everyone when out and about. This is only a common sense approach to any illness that is spread by air-born particles or human contact.

We were forced to canceled our last meeting and will probably cancel the April meeting as well so as to not put our people in harm's way. I trust that you will understand that this is only to protect our elderly members and members that have significant medical problems already without adding something else to their place.

We are working on a teleconferencing program to handle our staff meetings and anything of importance that comes up in the mean time. We are also looking for a way of contact all of you to see if you are doing well and if you require any assistance that we may be of help with. If there are any of you that need something feel free to contact one of the staff members or myself and we will do what we can to assist you. If that means bringing you food and medicine or some other aid we will do our best to accomplish that.

We feel this is a great time for all of us to get together as a detachment and reach out to all our members and check on them. Each of you know members and can call to ask how they are doing. You never know, they nay have so ideas on how to cope with this situation that you have never thought about. As terrible as this is, one day it will be over. God willing, we will be around to reflect on this in years to come and may even be able to laugh at some of the things we did while in isolation.

I have not been in isolation. I have been on the Naval Base with the people from Mission BBQ for several days per week this last month. We have been helping to feed the Sailors who have graduated boot camp or their other schools and can not ship out due to travel restrictions. The base has expanded quite a bit with personnel that can't leave. And feeding them has been a problem with the new orders to stay at least 6 feet away from everyone. So far none of us have gotten sick but we all needs your prayers also for our safety

We need to remember that only a small percentage of the people infected will actually get sick from this. A smaller parentage will die. Our goal is to practice proper precautions and try to deal with this virus in a sensible manner so that none of us will be a statistic. Remember, if you get sick with this virus you will be quarantined. No members of your family will be allowed visitation as long as you are in the hospital. If you pass away, only 10 people are allowed to come to your funeral. This does not allow for elderly people to attend. The Military WILL NOT give you Military honors at the funeral. If all the other reasons for trying to prevent this virus don't bother you, maybe these will.

I personally am looking forward to seeing all of you at the next meeting we have when we are allowed to gather again. I hope all of you are hoping for the same thing. Until we meet again stay safe, stay healthy, and do what you can for your friends, neighbors, and members of this detachment.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

This March, without a doubt, will go down in U.S. history as one of the most challenging since "9-11", not just for America, but for the whole planet!

The coronavirus or COVID-19, which invaded our country and the world beginning in February, was not created by our God to punish us. He will, however use it for our good.


