

"SMED"

Last month, the week after the Jarhead Journal was distributed, I received a phone call from one of our members telling me that after reading "SMED SAID", he made arrangements to get his Shingles vaccination. I told him, that years ago, when my Bride's sister (Sue) caught it and her eye swelled closed (as did mine), it never opened again. She lost the sight in that eye. Marine or not, her episode scared me "spitless"! My right eye is my "shootin' eye! Thanks for the phone-call Richard, you may have a reaction from the vaccination, but nowhere near the symptoms as you would receive from Shingles! Okay, enough! Let's get on with this month's rendition.

Way back, when I was in my mid 20's, I was introduced to John a friend of my father's. At the time, John was an automobile re-possessor, and was a pretty tough and crusty old guy. Dad told me John was in the Rangers (and I presumed at the time it was the U.S. Army). Also, he had a rather impressive collection of World War II weapons and other military type gear. Several years after meeting John, I actually bought a "repo" from him which was a 1964 Chevy Chevelle Hard-Top, small block V-8, four in the floor with posi-traction. (I did dote on that car, but that is another story!)

The Zion Police Department, in those days often relied on part time "Specials" to round out manpower on week-ends and holidays. John was hired as one of those "Specials" and often worked holidays and week-end evenings. Back then, there was no one riding "shotgun", all patrols were solo.

One late Saturday evening, (the story was told), John spotted a car heading north through town on Sheridan Road at an extremely high rate of speed. He pulled it over six blocks north at St. Rt. #173 and Sheridan Road to discover it held six older teenagers. He radioed the Police Station, located at 29th Street and Sheridan Road for assistance....none was available. He could not fit six large teens into his squad car so he improvised. He lined them all up along the highway, had them place their hands over their heads and 'Perp-marched' them single file eight blocks down the middle of Sheridan Road to the Police Station and "booked" them. They all spent the evening in the Zion jail. As I said earlier, he was one tough, crusty old guy. For years that episode left a pretty impressionable picture in my mind. The following Monday, John was called into the mayor's office for an explanation of Saturday evening's event, and was promptly relieved of his "Special Police" status. You see, one of the six lads marched down Sheridan Road was the mayor's son.

Years have passed until recently while reading about D-Day 1942, it mentioned the role Carlson's Raiders played on Guadalcanal. It suddenly dawned on me, John wasn't in the U.S. Army. He was a Marine in Carlson's Raiders of the Second Battalion, the first United States special operations forces to form and see combat during World War II. All those years I knew John, other than admitting he was a Carlson Raider, he would not discuss his military background, not even with his spouse Joyce. You don't know what you don't know! All that time, I rubbed shoulders with history and did not know it. Sure do wish we could still get together for a cup of coffee.
