I AM A MARINE

NEVER GIVE UP, NEVER SURRENDER

Every February the United States honors the contributions and sacrifices of African Americans who have helped shape our nation. February was chosen because both Abraham Lincoln and Fredrick Douglas have birthdays.

This month, I would like to honor a true American hero and Force Recon Marine legend who participated in over 50 classified missions, fought in five major campaigns, wounded 19 times in battle and is one of the most decorated African American to serve.

Major James Capers Jr. (August 25, 1937 – Drive On!) is the first African American Marine on a recruitment poster in 1967 titled "Ask A Marine." Major James Capers Jr. was the first African American officer in a Marine special operation to receive a battlefield commission to 2nd Lieutenant and was the first African American to command a Marine Reconnaissance company. He received a Silver Star, 2 Bronze Stars and 3 Purple Hearts and is nominated for the Medal of Honor.

His life story is in print titled "Faith Through the Storm: Memoirs of James Capers Jr."

Today the Gary and Dottie Capers Foundation (nonprofit in memory of his beloved wife and beautiful son) continues to offer financial support to all that strive to mitigate barriers to success while reducing the sense of helplessness that struggle creates.

Please join me in saluting this Marine who truly sacrificed and contributed to our beloved Marine Corps.
