COINCIDENCE

To all my Marine Corps League Brothers and Sisters in Lake County, Semper Fi!

How many of you believe in "coincidence"? I do not. I believe there is a plan, I just don't usually know what that plan is.

For instance, on a recent, and quick (36 hour) trip to Illinois, my bride and I were in a Mexican restaurant in Fulton, Mississippi, for a late dinner. Upon entering and being seated, I noticed two couples seated at an adjoining table. One of the gentlemen was wearing a Viet-Nam "baseball type" cap. As he glanced in my direction, I nodded, pointed to my head, pointed to him and mouthed "thank-you". He smiled, also nodded and resumed eating dinner with his table companions.

I began "ticking off" the street names, "Edina, Elizabeth, Elim, Elija, Elisha, Emmaus, Enoch, Eshcol, Bethel", and he stopped me and said, "Enoch"!

I was born in my grandmothers' house on Enoch and though at different times, we lived in houses within two blocks of each other. His dad was employed at Johnson otors (later known as Outboard Marine) before joining the Army Air Corps (which later became the Air Force). He was there when my father worked there.

I then asked what in the world brought him to the little town of Fulton if his home was in Tennessee? His wife (fifth) was from Fulton. I asked if either of them knew any Thorns or Dulaneys as they were my bride's grandparents? He told me Dulaneys General Store was one of his "favorite places" because if "Old Doyce could not find a part or product you needed it probably did not exist"! "Old Doyce" and his sister used to play "catch" with me out in front of that store back in the "sixties" when we visited my lady's relatives. "Old Doyce's father owned the store then and was Marty's uncle.

We exchanged challenge coins and contact info and returned to our respective tables to discover our ladies were having nearly identical conversations as ours had been.

As if this experience was not enough, the next morning in the hotel breakfast room, we encountered a family in town for a reunion. They were also from Zion. Their father (Jack) owned and operated a combination gas station/repair shop that was the only place I would allow a mechanic to tune my '56 Chevy Bel-Aire two door hardtop. Jack later sold that business and built a truck stop out on Stateline Road & Route #41, but that is another story.

This is indeed a small world, and I still do not believe in coincidence!
