

# Detachment 801 - STORAGE

The Detachment has many various items and equipment that we own such as tables, canopies, cooking gear, paper plates, cups, utensils', fund raising gear, pop up banners, easels, posters, wheel chair, Toys for Tots boxes and gear, Color Guard gear, etc, etc and so on.

In the past, we had a storage area that we rented. Then Jimmy Onad let us use one of the Connex boxes behind the Tiki bar for free. When his demand for storage increased we lost our free storage. A member donated a motorcycle trailer to haul boxes for Toys for Tots, so we stuffed as much gear as we could into the trailer. The rest of the gear is in numerous members homes. This has made it difficult to get gear when we need it.

We complicated the problem by selling the trailer. It was no longer road safe as the tires were dry rotting and the lighting wires were cut off while in storage.

We are looked to solve several problems at the same time--

Problem#1-- We need to consolidate our gear and equipment into one safe location where we have easy access to retrieve what we need (and make some members happy by getting it out of their house)

Problem #2-- If we buy a Storage Shed or Container, we have no place to put it. (continued)

**Solution--** We have purchased 2 Storage Containers-(40Lx8Wx9H). These are Connex boxes that they use to send supplies by ship, rail or truck. They are made of steel and are wind and water proof. Our costs are \$1,925 each, including delivery, plus \$100.00 in landscaping timber to set them on to keep them off the ground.

We will donate 1 to Veterans Closet, and they will allow us to place ours on their property at no cost. We will have an agreement, in writing, stating that the one belongs to Det. 801 and can be kept on Veteran's Closet property at no cost and the other belongs to them.

The League will buy 1 and the Foundation buy the one we donate to Veterans Closet. Our total costs will be \$3,850.

We will have some additional costs in the future for materials to build shelving and other modifications.
