The Name - Stronghold

Simply put, stronghold is a synonym for fort. We thought this was a great way to respect the town and its history.

Did you know?

The Stronghold building, constructed in 1906 by Charles Reach, stands on the Reach Block on Mainstreet and is now recognized as an Alberta Heritage Building.

The intricately carved wooden doors leading upstairs are believed to be from the 1600s and were imported from Spain. Originally used as courtyard doors, they were large enough for a horse to pass through. Each door has a concealed man door within it. Can you spot the patron saint of travelers on the door?

The bar, which was brought in from Montana, dates back to the 1800s.
