Some helpful ideas on how you can successfully introduce our services to both private and public schools.

Initial Contact with School

- Send an Introduction Letter Write a professional email or letter to school administrators, counselors, or teachers explaining Canines for Christ, our mission, and the benefits of therapy dog visits. Offer to meet in person to discuss how these visits can support students and staff.
- Follow Up with a Call or Visit After sending the letter, follow up with a phone call and request an inperson visit to answer questions and reinforce your interest in serving.
- Leverage Community Connections If you have contacts in the school system, such as teachers, parents, or counselors, ask them to introduce you to decision-makers who could facilitate a meeting.

Structuring Therapy Dog Visits - Providing Ideas to the School

- Classroom Visits Arrange small-group or one-on-one reading sessions where students can read to the therapy dog, fostering confidence and literacy.
- Counselor Support Sessions Collaborate with school counselors to provide comfort to students facing anxiety, stress, or emotional challenges. Suggest additional visits during times like Mental Health Awareness Month in May.
- Special Needs and Inclusion Programs Work with special education teachers to offer interaction sessions that benefit students with developmental disabilities.
- Stress-Relief Events Schedule visits during exams, standardized testing, or high-stress periods to help students and staff relax.

Educate on the Benefits of Therapy Dog Visits

- Emotional Support Reduces stress, anxiety, and depression among students and staff.
- Academic Encouragement Helps children develop reading skills and concentration in a nonjudgmental environment. Serves as a motivation and something special to look forward to.
- Social Connection Encourages positive social interactions and empathy among students.
- Crisis Response Provides comfort after difficult school events or personal hardships.
