  - 6. The location of the deposit and/or disposition of any proceeds from any such claim; and
  - 7. The attorney(s) representing responding party, and billing statements, notes, correspondence, memoranda, records of meetings and settlement negotiations, and other documents received from said attorneys or provided to said attorneys by responding party.
- 41. *Litigation*. Except for documents pertaining to this cause, documents pertaining to any lawsuits, civil actions, bankruptcy proceedings, claims, and/or other litigation in which either party to this lawsuit, and/or any entity in which either party to this lawsuit has or has had any interest has been a party, and for each such claim, including without limitation documents reflecting the following:
  - 1. The cause number and style of the case;
  - 2. The names of all parties; and
  - 3. The nature and disposition of the action.
- 42. Criminal Charges and Actions. Documents pertaining to any criminal charges, investigations, allegations, complaints, and convictions of either party to this lawsuit other than minor traffic violations, including without limitation all records of suspect, arrest, formal charges, and disposition.
- 43. Gifts and Loans to Others by Responding Party. Documents reflecting gifts and/or loans of any kind made by you to any person other than Requesting Party, including without limitation documents reflecting the date of each such gift, the amount of each such gift, expenditures made by you for the entertainment of another person, travel with another person, gifts to another

- 44. Education. Documents pertaining to yours, or any of your children's educational training, status, and progress, including without limitation formal or informal schooling, tutoring, counseling, and continuing education, whether public or private education, and including without limitation admittance applications, transcripts, report cards, school records, evaluations, test scores, course attendance and completion certificates, and disciplinary reports.
- 45. Religion. If you believe religion is a relevant issue in this cause, documents pertaining to your and/or the children's religious training and activities, whether formal or informal, including without limitation religious beliefs, activities, church, church affiliations, religious holidays, and religious ceremonies.
- 46. Videotapes, Audiotapes, and Other Documentary Evidence. The originals of videotapes, audio tapes, photographs, computer images and/or files, and/or other documents relevant to any issue in this cause, including out-takes therefrom, which videotapes, audio tapes, photographs, computer images and/or files, and/or other documents depict and/or record either party to this lawsuit, any property owned by either party to this lawsuit, and/or any person listed in response to any request for disclosure propounded to Responding Party.
- 47. Letters and/or Written Memoranda. Letters and/or written memoranda between you, Requesting Party, and/or any person listed in response to any request for disclosure and/or interrogatory propounded to Responding Party, and/or any other person, which are relevant to any issue in this cause.
- 48. Expert Witness Reports. Reports, statements, notes, memoranda, correspondence, billing statements, records of payments, underlying documentation, references and resources, and/or any other documents relevant to this cause which are contained in any file of, or held by, any potential expert witness in this case working for or on behalf of Responding Party.
- 49. Legal and Expert Witness Fees. Documents pertaining to the employment by you or on your behalf, attorneys, C.P.A.s, accountants, appraisers, actuaries, and/or other professionals in reference to this cause of action, including without limitation employment contracts, fee contracts, bills forwarded to you by said professional, records of payments made to said professional by you or

- on your behalf, and/or timeslips prepared by said professional and/or his or her staff.
- 50. Mental Health. Documents pertaining to your mental health, from the date of the marriage, through the present date, including without limitation psychiatric, psychological, psychotherapy, emotional, substance abuse, learning disability, or mental health counseling, and for each occurrence, including without limitation mental health bills, pharmaceutical records, reports, raw data, test results, diagnoses, prognoses, treatment notes, recommendations, referrals, findings, charts, files, records, and records of payment to any mental health professional.
- 51. Diaries and/or Journals. Diaries, personal records, logs, journals, and/or other writings by you, whether private or presented to another person, pertaining to any issue relevant in this cause.
- 52. Surveillance Items and Reports. Documents pertaining to, reflecting, or making comments concerning, any type of surveillance and/or investigation of Requesting Party at any time, whether or not such surveillance or investigation was conducted by a licensed private investigator or any other person (licensed or unlicensed), and whether or not such surveillance or investigation was made at your request or at the request of anyone acting on behalf of you (directly or indirectly), and including without limitation reports, tape recordings, videotape recordings, photographs, records of observations, memoranda, correspondence, billing statements, records of payments made to an investigator, documents provided to the investigator, and/or any other documents or tangible things which arise from any such investigation.
- 53. Calendars. Your personal and business calendars, appointment books, and/or any other documents relating to the schedule, activities, and/or appointments of either party to this lawsuit.
- 54. Documents Used in Preparation of Answers to Interrogatories and Requests for Disclosure. Documents used by you in preparing your answers to interrogatories and/or your responses to the request for disclosure in this cause, which are not already produced in response to other requests for production herein.
- 55. Email Correspondence, text messages, tweets, Facebook, Linkedin, or other social media. Any social media communications between you and Requesting Party and between you and other persons via email transmission, including deleted emails, or of an electronic nature during the past 12 months regarding or pertaining to the parties, the marriage, parent-child issues, or the property of either party, your travel plans or itineraries, your gifts or

transfer of monies or property to any other person or entity, and or any romantic or sexual relationship you have had with any person other than Requesting Party.
