



In your opinion, do you think child care is too expensive?




Would you say that child care is one of your largest monthly expenses?




Do you think Congress should address the cost of child care?




Do you think Congress should address the child care worker shortage and increase pay for child care workers?


Would you be in favor of Congress increasing federal funding for child care?




Would you like to see Democrats and Republicans in Congress work together on a child care bill?
