- To facilitate Carers to obtain the skills needed in their caring role.




Volunteers Comment




Comments from Carers and those with memory loss.

Assets

- 1. The Grove
- 2. The Old Rectory
- 3. Town Centre Projects



The Grove

- Former council office surplus to operational requirements
- Originally a residential mansion, then HQ of Carshalton UDC from 1923
- Planning consent obtained by Sutton Living
- 10 residential properties to be created
- No additional parking within Grove Park
- Construction and refurbishment ongoing
- Internal panelling featuring list of Mayors of Carshalton UDC until amalgamation in 1965 to be retrieved and retained.





The Old Rectory, Festival Walk

- Former council office surplus to needs
- Originally residential, acquired by Carshalton UDC in 1940s for office use
- Grade II* listed, conversion to apartments promoted by Sutton Living but not viable due to conservation constraints and additional cost/risk due to building materials inflation
- Historic England feedback was negative about impact on building fabric of work needed for apartment conversion
- Carter Jonas marketed for sale in Aug -Nov 2024.
- Council considering offers from suitable purchasers - due diligence ongoing.





The Old Rectory

A Reminder of the Options Considered

- Retain means continuing maintenance liability without an operational need
- Community-based use would normally mean council retaining liability
- Commercial use layout thought not consistent with modern office space, but some potential interest is being followed up
- Apartment scheme/ holiday letting not favoured by Historic England and Landmark Trust
- Residential refurbishment for single/dual dwelling considered that there
 would be demand and specialist knowledge/resources in the market.



Considerations During the Sale


- Complexity and risk attaching to Grade II* status
- Increased cost of conversion
- Additional maintenance required due to historic nature
- Additional listed building consents required and Historic England involvement
- Small grounds/gardens relative to size of property and limited parking, also subject to access rights
- Limited pool of capable and interested parties given the above factors.
